Routine Program Change Notice

STATEWIDE — Pursuant to 15 CFR 923.84, the New York State Department of State (DOS) hereby gives notice that the Federal Office of Ocean and Coastal Resource Management (OCRM) concurred on May 16, 2003 on the incorporation of the Village of Bayville Local Waterfront Revitalization Program (LWRP) into the State's Coastal Management Program (CMP) as a Routine Program Change. DOS requested OCRM's concurrence on this action on June 19, 2002 in a previous notice in the *State Register* which further described the content of the action.

The Local Waterfront Revitalization Program includes the following new or revised enforceable policies: #1, 3, 4, 5, 6, 9, 10, and 11. Other changes to the state's enforceable policies based on the LWRP are essentially the same as those found in state law under 19 NYCRR, Part 600.5.

Pursuant to the State CMP and Article 42 of the Executive Law, the Village of Bayville LWRP was adopted by the Village on October 28, 2002 and approved by the New York State Secretary of State on February 11, 2003.

Federal consistency with the Village of Bayville LWRP applies as of the date of this notice.

The New York State Department of State (DOS) is required by Federal regulations to provide timely public notice for the activities described below, which are subject to the consistency provisions of the Federal Coastal Zone Management Act of 1972, as amended.

The applicant has certified that the proposed activity complies with and will be conducted in a manner consistent with the approved New York State Coastal Management Program. The applicants' consistency certification and accompanying public information and data are available for inspection at the New York State Department of State offices located at 41 State Street in Albany, New York.

In F-2003-0589, Michael and Michele Shea, are proposing to reconstruct a bulkhead and deck at their Broad Channel, Queens property. The length of the proposed bulkhead repair will be 130.5 feet. The amount of area to be filled is approximately 110 cubic yards. For the reconstruction of the bulkhead, it is proposed that all riprap be removed, with any unnatural materials being disposed of off-site, replaced by natural stone. The reconstructed bulkhead will be 3" X 12" timber sheetpiling driven a minimum of 11' beyond the existing bank and will be at a slightly higher elevation (EL. 7.67) than the existing bulkhead (EL. 5.87). The deck and retaining wall will be rebuilt at a slightly higher elevation (EL. 7.50 and EL. 7.67, respectively) than the existing deck and wall (EL. 5.85 and EL. 5.87). As mitigation, a wetland buffer including beech grass, groundsel bush, and seaside lavender will be planted on a portion of the site.

The New York State Department of State (DOS) is required by Federal regulations to provide timely public notice for the activities described below, which are subject to the consistency provisions of the Federal Coastal Zone Management Act of 1972, as amended.

The applicant has certified that the proposed activity complies with and will be conducted in a manner consistent with the approved New York State Coastal Management Program. The applicant's consistency certification and accompanying public information and data are available for inspection at the New York State Department of State offices located at 41 State Street in Albany, New York.

In F-2003-0700, the applicant, John Swedberg d/b/a Mansion Marina, is proposing to expand the existing marina, at 112 Mansion Avenue, Staten Island, New York in Great Kills Harbor, by installing floating docks to accommodate 90 additional boats. The marina currently houses 186 boat slips; post-project, the marina will accommodate 276 vessels. The four additional floating docks will include the following: one 8' by 247' float; one 8' by 232' float; one 8' by 217' float; and one 8' by 196' float. To allow for these additional floats, the applicant proposes to dredge to a depth of 6' below mean low water (MLW), removing approximately 11,500 cubic yards of fill. These spoils will then be placed on a barge for removal to a disposal site.
