Executive Orders

State agencies must specify in each notice which proposes a rule the last date on which they will accept public comment. Agencies must always accept public comment: for a minimum of 60 days following publication in the *Register* of a Notice of Proposed Rule Making, or a Notice of Emergency Adoption and Proposed Rule Making; and for 30 days after publication of a Notice of Revised Rule Making, or a Notice of Emergency Adoption and Revised Rule Making in the *Register*. When a public hearing is required by statute, the hearing cannot be held until 60 days after publication of the notice, and comments must be accepted for at least 5 days after the last required hearing. When the public comment period ends on a Saturday, Sunday or legal holiday, agencies must accept comment through the close of business on the next succeeding workday.

For notices published in this issue:

- the 60-day period expires on January 20, 2019
- the 30-day period expires on December 21, 2018

Be a part of the rule making process!

The public is encouraged to comment on any of the proposed rules appearing in this issue. Comments must be made in writing and must be submitted to the agency that is proposing the rule. Address your comments to the agency representative whose name and address are printed in the notice of rule making. No special form is required; a handwritten letter will do. Individuals who access the online *Register* (www.dos.ny.gov) may send public comment via electronic mail to those recipients who provide an e-mail address in Notices of Proposed Rule Making. This includes Proposed, Emergency Proposed, Revised Proposed and Emergency Revised Proposed rule makings.

To be considered, comments should reach the agency before expiration of the public comment period. The law provides for a minimum 60-day public comment period after publication in the *Register* of every Notice of Proposed Rule Making, and a 30-day public comment period for every Notice of Revised Rule Making. If a public hearing is required by statute, public comments are accepted for at least five days after the last such hearing. Agencies are also required to specify in each notice the last date on which they will accept public comment.

When a time frame calculation ends on a Saturday or Sunday, the agency accepts public comment through the following Monday; when calculation ends on a holiday, public comment will be accepted through the following workday. Agencies cannot take action to adopt until the day after expiration of the public comment period.

The Administrative Regulations Review Commission (ARRC) reviews newly proposed regulations to examine issues of compliance with legislative intent, impact on the economy, and impact on affected parties. In addition to sending comments or recommendations to the agency, please do not hesitate to transmit your views to ARRC:

EMERGENCY RULE MAKING

Implementation of New York's Approved ESSA Plan to Comply with the Provisions of the Every Student Succeeds Act

PURSUANT TO THE PROVISIONS OF THE State Administrative Procedure Act, NOTICE is hereby given of the following action:

Action taken: Amendment of sections 100.2(ff), (m), 100.18, 100.19 and Part 120; addition of section 100.21 to Title 8 NYCRR.

Statutory authority: Education Law, sections 101, 112(1), 207, 210, 215, 305(1), (2), (20), 309, 3713(1), (2); The Elementary and Secondary Education Act of 1965, as amended by the Every Student Succeeds Act of 2015, 20 U.S.C. sections 6301 et. seq. (Public Law 114-95, 129 STAT. 1802)

Finding of necessity for emergency rule: Preservation of general welfare.

Specific reasons underlying the finding of necessity: On December 10, 2015, the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA) was signed into law by President Obama. This bipartisan measure reauthorized the 50-year-old Elementary and Secondary Education Act, which provides federal funds to improve elementary and secondary education in the nation's public schools and requires states and school districts, as a condition of funding, to take a variety of actions to ensure all children, regardless of race, income, background, or where they live, receive the education they need to prepare them for success in postsecondary education, careers, and citizenship. New York State receives approximately \$1.6 billion annually in funding through ESSA.

After an extensive, 18-month long public engagement process, the Department, with Board approval, submitted New York State's ESSA plan to the USDE for review on September 17, 2018. Subsequently, the Department met regularly with the USDE to provide clarifications on the plan. On January 17, 2018, the USDE approved the State's plan. In January 2018, the Department provided the Board of Regents with an update on the approved plan and in March 2018, the Department provided an update regarding the financial transparency requirements related to ESSA. In April 2018, the Department provided Board of Regents with a detailed summary of the proposed amendment and the Board of Regents voted to authorize Department staff to publish the proposed amendment in the *State Register* for the 60-day public comment period so that the Department had an opportunity to receive as much public comment as possible before adoption as an emergency rule for the 2018-2019 school year, as required under ESSA.

In order to implement the State's USDE approved ESSA Plan and to prepare for implementation of the plan beginning with the 2018-19 school year, a new section 100.21 and amendments to Commissioner's Regulations sections 100.2(ff), 100.2(m), 100.18, 100.19 and Part 120 were made to align the Commissioner's Regulations with the approved ESSA plan, relating to New York State's updated accountability system.

A Notice of Proposed Rulemaking was published in the *State Register* on May 9, 2018 and based on comments from the field, revisions were made to the proposed amendment. As a result, a Notice of Emergency Adoption and Revised Rule Making was published in the *State Register* on July 18, 2018. Based on comments received during the public comment period on the revised rule making, the Department made further revisions to the regulation and a Notice of Emergency Adoption and Revised Rule Making was published in the *State Register* on October 3, 2018. Because the Board of Regents meets at scheduled intervals, the December 2018 Regents meeting is the earliest the proposed rule could be presented for adoption, after expiration of the 30-day public comment period required under the State Administrative Procedure Act for a revised rulemaking. However, since the 2018-2019 school year began on July 1, 2018 emergency adoption is necessary for the preservation of the general welfare to ensure that the emergency rule adopted at the June 2018 Regents and the revisions adopted at the September 2018 Regents meeting remain continuously in effect until the rule can be adopted as a permanent rule in order to timely implement New York State's approved ESSA plan, so that school districts may timely meet school/school district accountability requirements for the 2018-2019 school year and beyond, consistent with the approved ESSA plan and pursuant to statutory requirements. It is anticipated that the proposed rule will be presented to the Board of Regents for permanent adoption at its December 2018 meeting.

Subject: The implementation of New York's approved ESSA plan to comply with the provisions of the Every Student Succeeds Act.

Purpose: To implement New York's approved ESSA plan and to comply with the provisions of the Every Student Succeeds Act.

Substance of emergency rule (Full text is posted at the following State website: <http://www.counsel.nysed.gov/rulesandregs>): The Commissioner of Education proposes to amend sections 100.2(ff), 100.2(m), 100.18, 100.19 and Part 120 of the Regulations of the Commissioner of Education relating to Relating to the implementation of the State's Approved Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA) Plan. The following is a summary of the proposed rule:

The proposed amendment to subdivision 100.2(ff) relates to the enrollment of youth released or conditionally released from residential facilities. This amendment clarifies the existing requirement that districts designate an employee(s) to be the transition liaison(s) with residential facility personnel, parents, students, and State and other local agencies for the purpose of facilitating a student's effective educational transition into, between, and out of such facilities to ensure that each student receives appropriate educational and appropriate supports, services, and opportunities; and this amendment also provides an overview of the duties of the liaison(s).

The proposed amendment to subdivision 100.2(m) relates to requirements for the New York State report card for schools and districts. This amendment updates the information to be provided in report cards to align with the provisions of ESSA and requires local educational agencies (LEAs) to post the local report cards on their website, where one exists, to satisfy ESSA's local report card requirements. If an LEA does not operate a website, the LEA must provide the information to the public in another manner determined by the LEA.

The proposed amendments to 100.18 clarify that this section, which contains provisions relating to implementation of New York's approved ESEA flexibility waiver, only applies to accountability designations made prior to July 1, 2018, except as otherwise provided in the new section 100.21.

In order to implement the State's approved ESSA plan, the proposed amendments to section 100.19 clarify that Failing Schools means schools that have been identified as Priority Schools and/or Comprehensive Support and Improvement Schools (CSI) for at least three consecutive years. (See Attachment A for criteria for identification of a Comprehensive Support and Improvement School.) These amendments also clarify that beginning with the 2018-19 school year, removal from receivership will be based upon a school's status as a CSI rather than as a Priority School.

The proposed creation of section 100.21 implements the new accountability and support and interventions of the State's approved ESSA plan commencing with the 2018-2019 school year. Such provisions shall include, but not be limited to, the following:

- Subdivision (a) sets forth an applicability clause which says that section 100.21 supersedes paragraphs (p)(1) through (11) and (14) through (16) of section 100.2 and section 100.18, which are the provisions of Commissioner's Regulations that were in place under the No Child Left Behind Act (NCLB) and the Department's Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA) flexibility waiver, and that the new section 100.21 shall apply in lieu of such provisions during the period of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act, as amended by the Every Student Succeeds Act, and any revisions and extensions thereof, except as otherwise provided in section 100.21. If a provision of section 100.2(p) or of section 100.18 conflicts with section 100.21, the provisions of section 100.21 shall prevail.

- Subdivision (b) defines various terms, which are divided into general definitions, definitions related to school and district accountability, definitions related to school and district accountability designations, and definitions related to interventions for designated schools and districts to implement the new accountability system in New York State's approved ESSA plan.

- Subdivision (c) outlines the procedures and requirements for registration of public schools, which remain the same as under the previous accountability regulations.

- Subdivision (d) relates to the requirements for the registration of public schools.

- Subdivision (e) provides that, commencing with the 2017-2018 school year results, the Commissioner will annually review the performance of all public schools, charter schools, and school districts in the State. The Commissioner shall determine whether such public school, charter school or school district shall be identified for Comprehensive Support and Improvement (CSI), Targeted Support and Improvement (TSI), or identified as a Target District in accordance with the criteria set forth in subdivision (f) of the regulation.

- Subdivision (f) specifies the differentiated accountability methodology by which schools will be identified as either CSI (which will be identified every three years beginning with the 2018-2019 school year using 2017-2018 school year results) or TSI (which will be identified annually beginning with the 2018-2019 school year), and the methodology for identifying Target Districts. This section describes how six indicators

(composite performance, student growth, combined composite performance and growth, English language proficiency, academic progress, and chronic absenteeism) are used in the methodology for identification of elementary and middle schools. This section also details how seven indicators (composite performance; graduation rate; combined composite performance and graduation rate; English language proficiency; academic progress; chronic absenteeism; and college, career, and civic readiness) are used in the methodology for identifying high schools. This subdivision also explains how each of these indicators is computed, how these computations are converted into a Level 1-4 for each accountability group for which a school or district is accountable, and how these levels assigned to the accountability groups are used to determine whether a school will be identified as in Good Standing, TSI, or CSI, and whether a district will be identified as a District in Good Standing or a Target District. This subdivision also contains provisions regarding the identification of high schools for CSI based on graduation rates below 67% beginning with 2017-18 school year results. In addition, this subdivision contains provisions regarding the identification of TSI schools for additional support as required by ESSA if an accountability group for which a school is identified performs at a level that would have caused the school to be identified as CSI if this had been the performance of the "all students" group.

- Subdivision (g) provides that preliminarily identified CSI and TSI schools and Target Districts shall be given the opportunity to provide the Commissioner with any additional information concerning extenuating or extraordinary circumstances faced by the school or district that should be cause for the Commissioner to not identify the school as CSI or TSI or the district as a Target District.

- Subdivision (h) establishes the public notification requirements upon receipt of a designation of CSI or TSI school or a Target District.

- Subdivision (i) specifies the interventions that must occur in schools identified as CSI or TSI, as well as districts identified as Target Districts. This section describes the requirements for identified schools as they relate to parental involvement, participatory budgeting, school comprehensive education plans, and school choice. This subdivision also describes the increased support and oversight that schools that fail to improve will receive. This subdivision also outlines the interventions for schools that, beginning with 2017-18 and 2018-19 school year results, has a Weighted Average Achievement Level of 1 or 2 and that fails for two consecutive years to meet the 95% participation rate requirement for annual state assessments for the same accountability group for the same accountability measure and are not showing improvement in the participation rate for that accountability group. This subdivision also specifies the support that districts must provide to a school that is not CSI or TSI but has performed at Level 1 for an accountability group for an accountability measure.

- Subdivision (j) establishes the criteria for a school's or a district's removal from an accountability designation.

- Subdivision (k) provides the criteria for the identification of schools for public school registration review. Under this subdivision, the Commissioner may place under preliminary registration review any school identified for receivership; any school that is identified as CSI for three consecutive years; and any school that has been identified as a poor learning environment. Also, under this subdivision, a school under registration review shall also be identified as a CSI school, and subject to all the requirements of that designation.

- Subdivision (l) specifies the process by which the Commissioner will place a school under registration review; and the required actions of the district and the school related to the designation. This subdivision also describes the requirements for receivership schools that have also been identified for registration review.

- Subdivision (m) specifies the criteria and process for removal of schools from registration review, school phase-out or closure.

The proposed amendments to Part 120 update provisions in the existing regulations pertaining to the sunset of No Child Left Behind requirements regarding highly qualified teachers and provide for the continuation under ESSA of provisions pertaining to persistently dangerous schools and unsafe school choice and updates to public school choice provisions.

This notice is intended to serve only as a notice of emergency adoption. This agency intends to adopt the provisions of this emergency rule as a permanent rule, having previously submitted to the Department of State a notice of proposed rule making, I.D. No. EDU-19-18-00006-P, Issue of May 9, 2018. The emergency rule will expire January 4, 2019.

Regulatory Impact Statement, Regulatory Flexibility Analysis, Rural Area Flexibility Analysis and Job Impact Statement

A Notice of Proposed Rulemaking was published in the State Register on May 9, 2018. A Notice of Emergency Adoption and Revised Rule Making was published in the State Register on July 18, 2018. A second Notice of

Emergency Adoption and Revised Rule Making was published in the State Register on October 3, 2018. No revisions were made to the proposed rule since publication in the State Register on October 3, 2018. Therefore, no revisions are required to the previously published Regulatory Impact Statement, Regulatory Flexibility Analysis, Rural Area Flexibility Analysis and Job Impact Statement.

Assessment of Public Comment

1. COMMENT:

Commenter, an education software company, sought information related to the ability of school districts to use ESSA funds to purchase a particular product.

DEPARTMENT RESPONSE:

No response necessary as the comment is outside the scope of the proposed rulemaking.

2. COMMENT:

Commenter, a parent, wrote to express his frustration about the learning and environmental conditions of a particular school, which was designated as a priority school under the previous accountability system required for compliance with No Child Left Behind. Commenter noted that his older child received a transfer to a better performing school as a result of the school's designation as a priority school and is pleased with that child's current school placement.

DEPARTMENT RESPONSE:

As evidenced by New York's federally approved ESSA plan and this proposed rulemaking, the Department aims to implement an accountability system that will support the education of all students in New York. However, this particular comment is outside the scope of the proposed rulemaking and, as such, no changes are necessary.

3. COMMENT:

Several commenters echoed previously received comments and expressed concern relating to participation rate, parental rights, and the value of the assessments.

DEPARTMENT RESPONSE:

Please see response to Comment #8 in the previously published Assessment of Public Comment, published in the State Register on October 3, 2018.

4. COMMENT:

A few commenters expressed previously received concerns regarding the provisions that permit the Commissioner to impose a financial penalty by requiring districts to set aside Title I funds to implement the recommendations of a participation rate audit if a school has failed to improve the participation rate for an identified group in the subject for which the group was identified for three years following first implementation of a participation rate improvement plan.

DEPARTMENT RESPONSE:

5. COMMENT:

A few commenters expressed frustration with the overall system of state assessments and the common core learning standards.

Administration of Certain Vaccines by Pharmacists

PURSUANT TO THE PROVISIONS OF THE State Administrative Procedure Act, NOTICE is hereby given of the following action:

Action taken: Amendment of section 63.9 of Title 8 NYCRR.

Statutory authority: Education Law, sections 207(not subdivided), 6504(not subdivided), 6507(2), 6527(7), 6801(2), (4), 6802(22), 6902(1), 6909(7); L. 2018, ch. 57, part DD

Finding of necessity for emergency rule: Preservation of public health and general welfare.

Specific reasons underlying the finding of necessity: The proposed amendment to the Regulations of the Commissioner of Education is necessary to implement Part DD of Chapter 57 of the Laws of 2018 (Part DD

of Chapter 57), which amended the Education Law in relation to administration of immunizations by certified pharmacists. Part DD of Chapter 57 was enacted, in part, to make seasonal influenza vaccines more readily available to children, effective April 12, 2018. Prior to the enactment of Part DD of Chapter 57, pharmacists could not administer seasonal influenza vaccine to patients under nineteen years of age, unless the Governor declared a state of emergency.

Part DD of Chapter 57 also expands the definition of an immunizing agent to include vaccines that are administered by inhalation. Part DD of Chapter 57 further authorizes licensed pharmacists to execute patient specific and non-patient specific orders prescribed by a physician or nurse practitioner to administer influenza vaccine to children between two and eighteen years of age. Additionally, it authorizes the Commissioner of Health to issue a statewide non-patient specific order for pharmacists to administer influenza vaccine to children between two and eighteen years of age during an influenza outbreak.

In addition, Part DD of Chapter 57 amends the Public Health Law to require a certified pharmacist to report all immunizations administered to a patient under nineteen years of age to be reported to either the New York State Immunization Information System (NYSIIS) or if administered in New York City, to the Citywide Immunization Registry (CIR), as required by the Public Health Law or the New York City Health Code.

The proposed amendment to paragraph (2) of subdivision (b) of section 63.9 of the Regulations of the Commissioner of Education authorizes pharmacists to immunize children between the ages of two and eighteen against seasonal influenza.

The proposed amendment to paragraph (4) of subdivision (b) of section 63.9 of the Regulations of the Commissioner of Education requires a certified pharmacist, when administering an immunization in a pharmacy, to provide for an area that provides for the patient's privacy, which includes education materials, as determined by the Commissioner and Commissioner of Health, on influenza vaccinations for children. It also requires reporting of the immunization to the attending primary health care practitioner, and to NYSIIS or the CIR.

The proposed amendment was presented to the Professional Practice Committee for recommendation and to the Full Board for adoption as an emergency action at the June 2018 meeting of the Board of Regents, effective June 12, 2018. A Notice of Emergency Action and Proposed Rule Making was published in the State Register on June 27, 2018 for a 60-day public comment period. The Department received comments from one commenter, but those comments did not necessitate any revisions to the proposed amendment.

Because the June emergency action was set to expire on September 9, 2018, at the July 2018 Regents meeting, a second emergency action was adopted to ensure that the emergency rule adopted at the June 2018 Regents meeting remained continuously in effect until the effective date of its adoption as a permanent rule. However, after the adoption of the second emergency action at the July meeting, Department staff determined that the proposed rule inadvertently failed to amend the provisions of section 63.9 of the Regulations of the Commissioner of Education to extend pharmacists' authority to administer medications for the treatment of anaphylaxis to patients two years of age and older, as required by Part DD of the Chapter 57. To address this unintentional omission, revisions were made to the proposed rule. Thereafter, at the September 17-18, 2018 Regents meeting, the second emergency action was repealed effective September 18, 2018, and the revised proposed rule was adopted on an emergency basis (third emergency), to ensure that the emergency rule, as revised, remains continuously in effect until the effective date of its adoption as a permanent rule. A Notice of Emergency Adoption and Revised Rule Making was published in the State Register on October 3, 2018 for an additional 30-day public comment period.

Since the Board of Regents meets at fixed intervals, the earliest the revised proposed rule can be presented for adoption, after expiration of the required 30-day comment period provided for in the State Administrative Procedure Act (SAPA) sections 202(4-a), would be the December 10-11, 2018 Regents meeting. Furthermore, pursuant to SAPA section 203(1), the earliest effective date of the revised proposed rule, if adopted at the December meeting, would be December 26, 2018, the date the Notice of Adoption would be published in the State Register. However, Part DD of Chapter 57 of the Laws of 2018 became effective on April 12, 2018. If the rule were to lapse, it would impede the ability of pharmacists to continue to immunize children between the ages of two and eighteen against seasonal influenza pursuant to a patient specific order or a non-patient specific order.

Therefore, a fourth emergency action is necessary at the November 2018 Regents meeting for the preservation of the public health and general welfare in order to continue to implement Part DD of Chapter 57 of the Laws of 2018, which is already in effect, to, inter alia, authorize pharmacists to immunize children between the ages of two and eighteen against seasonal influenza pursuant to a patient specific order or a non-patient specific order.

It is anticipated that the revised proposed rule will be presented for adoption as a permanent rule at the December 10-11, 2018 Regents meeting, which is the first scheduled meeting after publication of a Notice of Emergency Adoption and Revised Rule Making in the State Register and expiration of the 30-day public comment period as required by prescribed SAPA section 202(4-a).

Subject: Administration of certain vaccines by pharmacists.

Purpose: To implement the provisions of part DD of chapter 57 of the Laws of 2018.

Text of emergency rule: 1. Paragraph (2) of subdivision (b) of section 63.9 of the Regulations of the Commissioner of Education is amended, as follows:

(b) Immunizations.

(2) Authorized immunization agents. A certified pharmacist who meets the requirements of this section shall be authorized to administer to [patients 18 years of age or older, immunizing agents to prevent influenza, pneumococcal, acute herpes zoster, meningococcal, tetanus, diphtheria or pertussis disease, pursuant to a patient specific order or a non-patient specific order.]:

(i) *patients 18 years of age or older, immunizing agents to prevent influenza, pneumococcal, acute herpes zoster, meningococcal, tetanus, diphtheria or pertussis disease, pursuant to a patient specific order or a non-patient specific order; and*

(ii) *patients between the ages of two and eighteen years of age, immunizing agents to prevent influenza, pursuant to a patient specific order or a non-patient specific order.*

2. Paragraph (4) of subdivision (b) of section 63.9 of the Regulations of the Commissioner of Education is amended, as follows:

(4) Standards, procedures and reporting requirements for the administration of immunization agents. Each certified pharmacist shall comply with the following requirements when administering an immunization agent pursuant to either a patient specific order or a non-patient specific order and protocol:

- (i) . . .
- (ii) . . .
- (iii) . . .
- (iv) . . .
- (v) . . .

(vi) a certified pharmacist, when administering an immunization in a pharmacy, shall provide for an area that provides for the patient's privacy, such area shall include:

(a) a clearly visible posting of the most current "Recommended Adult Immunization Schedule" published by the advisory committee for immunization practices (ACIP); and [the certified pharmacist shall provide a copy of the appropriate vaccine information statement to the recipient, or the person legally responsible for the recipient when the patient is incapable of consenting to the immunization, before administering the immunization.];

(b) *education materials on influenza vaccines for children as determined by the Commissioner and the Commissioner of the Department of Health.*

(vii) *a certified pharmacist shall provide a copy of the appropriate vaccine information statement to the recipient, or the person legally responsible for the recipient when the patient is incapable of consenting to the immunization, before administering the immunization;*

(viii) a certified pharmacist shall provide to each recipient or other person legally responsible when the recipient is incapable of consenting to immunization, a signed certificate of immunization with the recipient's name, date of immunization, address of administration, administering pharmacist, immunization agent, manufacturer and lot number. With the consent of the recipient or a person legally responsible when the recipient is incapable of consenting, the certified pharmacist shall communicate this information to the recipient's primary health care practitioner, if one exists, within one month of the administration of such immunization, and such communication may be transmitted in electronic format;

[(viii)] (ix) a certified pharmacist shall report any adverse outcomes as may be required by Federal law on the vaccine adverse event reporting system form of the Centers for Disease Control of the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services, or on the successor form;

[(ix)] (x) a certified pharmacist shall ensure that a record of all persons immunized including the recipient's name, date, address of administration, administering pharmacist, immunization agent, manufacturer and lot number is recorded and maintained in accordance with section 29.2(a)(3) of this Title;

[(x)] (xi) to the extent required by the Public Health Law, the Education Law and/or the New York City Health Code, a certified pharmacist shall report the administration of any immunizations to the New York State Department of Health and/or the New York City Department of Health and Mental Hygiene, in a manner required by the Commis-

sioner of Health of the State of New York or of the City of New York, as applicable. Such report shall not include any individually identifiable health information unless:

(a) such information is otherwise required by law; or

(b) the recipient has consented to the disclosure of such information, in which case the information may be included to the extent permitted by law; and

[(xi)] (xii) each certified pharmacist shall provide information to recipients on the importance of having a primary health care practitioner, in a form or format developed by the Commissioner of Health;

[(xii)] (xiii) each certified pharmacist shall, prior to administering the immunization or immunizations, inform the recipient, or the person legally responsible for the recipient when the patient is incapable of consenting to the immunization, of the total cost of the immunization or immunizations, subtracting any health insurance subsidization, if applicable. In the case where the immunization is not covered, the pharmacist shall inform the recipient, or other person legally responsible for the recipient when the patient is incapable of consenting to the immunization, that the immunization may be covered when administered by a primary care physician or health care practitioner; and

[(xiii)] (xiv) Reporting of administration of immunizing agent;

(a) [For administrations prior to December 27, 2015, when a licensed pharmacist administers an immunizing agent, he or she shall report such administration to the patient's attending primary health care practitioner or practitioners, if any, unless the patient is unable to communicate the identity of his or her primary health care practitioner;

(b) For administrations on or after December 27, 2015,] when a licensed pharmacist administers an immunizing agent, he or she shall report such administration by electronic transmission or facsimile to the patient's attending primary health care practitioner or practitioners, if any, unless the patient is unable to communicate the identity of his or her primary health care practitioner, and, to the extent practicable, make himself or herself available to discuss the outcome of such immunization, including any adverse reactions, with the attending primary health care practitioner, or to the statewide immunization registry or the citywide immunization registry, as established pursuant to sections 2168 of the Public Health Law and 11.07 of the New York City Health Code, respectively.

3. Paragraph (1) of subdivision (c) of section 63.9 of the Regulations of the Commissioner of Education is amended, as follows:

(c) Anaphylaxis treatment agents.

(1) Pursuant to sections 6801 and 6802 of the Education Law, each pharmacist who is issued a certificate of administration pursuant to this section shall be authorized to administer medications for the emergency treatment of anaphylaxis to patients [18] 2 years of age or older.

4. Subparagraph (i) of paragraph (3) of subdivision (c) of section 63.9 of the Regulations of the Commissioner of Education is amended, as follows:

(3) Non-patient specific order and protocol.

(i) The certified pharmacist shall either maintain or ensure the maintenance of a copy of the non-patient specific order and protocol prescribed by a licensed physician or a certified nurse practitioner that authorizes such pharmacist to administer medications for the emergency treatment of anaphylaxis to [adults] *patients 2 years of age or older*, in accordance with the requirements of paragraph (1) of this subdivision. The order prescribed in subparagraph (ii) of this paragraph shall incorporate a protocol that meets the requirements of subparagraph (iii) of this paragraph. Such order and protocol shall be considered a record of the patient who receives the anaphylaxis treatment agent and maintained as a record for the patient who receives the anaphylaxis treatment agent. A record of each patient shall be maintained in either:

- (a) . . .
- (b) . . .

This notice is intended to serve only as a notice of emergency adoption. This agency intends to adopt the provisions of this emergency rule as a permanent rule, having previously submitted to the Department of State a notice of proposed rule making, I.D. No. EDU-26-18-00009-EP, Issue of June 27, 2018. The emergency rule will expire January 4, 2019.

PURSUANT TO THE PROVISIONS OF THE State Administrative Procedure Act, NOTICE is hereby given of the following action:

Proposed Action: Amendment of section 154-2.3 of Title 8 NYCRR.

Statutory authority: Education Law, sections 207(not subdivided), 208(not subdivided), 305(1), (3), 2711, 2854(1) and 3204

Finding of necessity for emergency rule: Preservation of general welfare.

Specific reasons underlying the finding of necessity: The proposed amendment is necessary, beginning with the 2018-2019 school year, to implement Regents policy to permit certain eligible school districts to seek a waiver from the requirement in Commissioner's Regulations section 154-2.3(i) which provides that the maximum allowable grade span for grouping instruction in grades 1-12 English as a new language or bilingual education classes is two contiguous grades, except for English language learners in a special class.

Since the Board of Regents meets at fixed intervals, the earliest the proposed rule can be presented for regular (non-emergency) adoption, after expiration of the required 60-day public comment period provided for in the State Administrative Procedure Act (SAPA) sections 201(1) and (5), would be the March 2019 Regents meeting. Furthermore, pursuant to SAPA section 203(1), the earliest effective date of the proposed rule, if adopted at the March meeting, would be March 27, 2019, the date a Notice of Adoption would be published in the State Register.

Therefore, emergency action is necessary at the November 2018 Regents meeting for the preservation of the general welfare in order to ensure that eligible school districts have enough notice that they may seek such waiver for the 2018-2019 school year. It is anticipated that the proposed rule will be presented for adoption as a permanent rule at the March 2019 Regents meeting, which is the first scheduled meeting after expiration of the 60-day public comment period prescribed in the SAPA for State agency rule makings.

Subject: English Language Learner Grade Span Waiver Requirement.

Purpose: To provide a one-year renewable waiver to expand the allowable grade span for ENL and BE classes to three contiguous grades.

Text of emergency/proposed rule: Subdivision (i) of section 154-2.3 of the Regulations of the Commissioner of Education is amended, to read as follows:

(i) Grade Span.

(1) The maximum allowable grade span for grouping instruction in grades 1-12 English as a new language or bilingual education classes is two contiguous grades, except for English language learners in a special class, as defined by section 200.1(uu) of this Title. *Provided, however, that beginning with the 2018-2019 school year the Commissioner may waive such requirement for school districts with enrollment of fewer than thirty English language learner students and permit such districts to utilize a maximum allowable grade span for instruction in grades 1-12 English as a new language or bilingual education classes of three contiguous grades, except for English language learners in a special class, as defined by section 200.1(uu) of this Title. A district seeking permission for such a waiver shall annually submit to the commissioner for approval an application on a form prescribed by the commissioner which must include:*

(i) *data regarding the number and percentages of English language learners enrolled in the district, along with data regarding the number of certified bilingual education and English to speakers of other languages teachers in the district;*

(ii) *evidence that the district will ensure that all English language learners receive grade and age appropriate instructional support if the waiver is granted; and*

(iii) *evidence regarding the district's efforts to meet the two grade span requirement of this subparagraph prior to seeking a waiver.*

This notice is intended: to serve as both a notice of emergency adoption and a notice of proposed rule making. The emergency rule will expire February 3, 2019.

Regulatory Impact Statement**1. STATUTORY AUTHORITY:**

Education Law 207 (not subdivided) grants general rule-making authority to the Regents to carry into effect State educational laws and policies.

Education Law 208(not subdivided) grants the authority to confer by diploma under their seal such degrees as they deem proper, and to award certificates, diplomas and degrees on persons who satisfactorily meet those requirements.

Education Law 305(1) and (3) authorizes the Commissioner to enforce the educational policies of this State and execute all educational policies determined by the Regents and shall prescribe the licensing of teachers employed in this State.

Education Law 2117 requires the school authorities of each school district to make a report to the Commissioner upon any particular matter relating to their schools whenever such report shall be required by Commissioner.

Education Law 2854(1)(b) provides that charter schools shall be exempt from all other state and local laws, rules, regulations or policies governing public or private schools, boards of education, school districts and political subdivisions, including those relating to school personnel and students, except as specifically provided in the school's charter or in this article.

Education Law 3204(2) and (2-a) requires that instruction only be given by a component instruction and that in the teaching of subjects of instruction, English shall be the language of instruction. It also requires that each district that is receiving foundation aid develop a comprehensive plan to meet the educational needs of pupils of limited English proficiency.

2. LEGISLATIVE OBJECTIVES:

The purpose of the proposed amendment is to provide a one-year renewable waiver to allow districts with fewer than 30 ELLs to seek approval from the Commissioner to expand the allowable grade span for ENL and BE classes to three contiguous grades.

The purpose of the proposed amendment is to provide a one-year renewable waiver allowing districts with fewer than 30 ELLs to seek approval from the Commissioner to expand the allowable grade span for ENL and BE classes to three contiguous grades.

5. RURAL AREA PARTICIPATION:

Copies of the proposed amendments have been provided to Rural Advisory Committee for review and comment.

Job Impact Statement

The purpose of the proposed amendment is to provide a one-year renewable waiver allowing districts with fewer than 30 ELLs to seek approval from the Commissioner to expand the allowable grade span for ENL and BE classes to three contiguous grades.

Because there is a demonstrated shortage of ELL and BE teachers, it is evident from the nature of the proposed amendment that it will have little or no impact on the number of jobs or employment opportunities in New York State, no further steps were needed to ascertain that fact and none were taken.

Self-Exclusion and Casino Advertising

I.D. No. SGC-47-18-00009-P

PURSUANT TO THE PROVISIONS OF THE State Administrative Procedure Act, NOTICE is hereby given of the following proposed rule:

Proposed Action: Repeal of Parts 4044, 4123, 4237, 4411, 5326 and section 5117.6(e)-(h); amendment of sections 5116.6 and 5325.6; addition of Parts 5402 and 5403 to Title 9 NYCRR.

Statutory authority: Racing, Pari-Mutuel Wagering and Breeding Law, sections 103, 104(19), 111 and 1344

Subject: Self-exclusion and casino advertising.

Purpose: To centralize Commission self-exclusion policies and make self-exclusion universal throughout the various forms of gaming.

Substance of proposed rule (Full text is posted at the following State website: https://www.gaming.ny.gov/proposed_rules.php): The addition of Parts 5402 and 5403 of Subtitle T of Title 9 NYCRR will allow the New York State Gaming Commission (“Commission”) to prescribe the procedures to make self-exclusion universal throughout the various forms of gaming Statewide, rather than limit it to one form of gaming or another.

Part 5402 establishes self-exclusion policies. The proposal would require that a person file a request for self-exclusion, to include the length of exclusion sought (one year, three years, five years or lifetime). A self-excluded person would be prohibited from collecting winnings or recovering losses occurring during the exclusion period and would be subject to possible arrest for trespass if found on the premises of a place from which the person is excluded. Upon registration, the excluded person would be required to release any claims that could arise from a failure by the State, Commission or Commission licensees or operators of gaming activity to withhold or restore gaming privileges or from confiscation of such person’s winnings. A gaming operator would be required to establish procedures and training for its employees to identify and manage any self-excluded persons found to be present on a gaming floor or involved in gaming-related activities.

Part 5403 consolidates current rules allowing for self-imposed restrictions in the amount of wagering on horse racing, eliminating duplicative provisions currently in the Thoroughbred, Standardbred, Quarterhorse and off-track betting rules.

The amendment of subdivision (b) of section 5325.6 of the regulations in regard to advertising of commercial casinos would be to correct texting contact information for the New York State HOPEline.

Regulatory Impact Statement

1. **STATUTORY AUTHORITY:** Racing, Pari-Mutuel Wagering and Breeding Law (“Racing Law”) section 103 authorizes the Gaming Commission (“Commission”) to carry out responsibilities relating to the regulation and enforcement of gaming and 104(19) grants authority to the Commission to promulgate rules and regulations that it deems necessary to carry out its responsibilities. Racing Law section 111 requires the Commission to promulgate rules and regulations enabling people to exclude themselves voluntarily from gaming activities.

Racing Law section 1344 requires the Commission to provide by regulation the establishment of a list of persons self-excluded from gaming activities.

2. **LEGISLATIVE OBJECTIVES:** This rule making carries out the legislative objectives of the above-referenced statutes.

3. **NEEDS AND BENEFITS:** This rule making proposed consolidated and amended regulations for self-exclusion from gaming activities. Currently, there are different self-exclusion rules applying to different forms of gaming. This proposal would centralize Commission self-exclusion policies and make self-exclusion universal throughout the various forms of gaming Statewide, rather than limit it to one form of gaming or another. Contact information for the New York State HOPEline would be corrected in the advertising regulations for commercial casinos.

4. **COSTS:**

(a) Costs to the regulated parties for the implementation of and continuing compliance with these rules: The rules prescribe self-exclusion procedures under the Racing, Pari-Mutuel Wagering and Breeding Law and do not impose any new costs.

(b) Costs to the regulating agency, the State, and local governments for the implementation of and continued administration of the rule: The rules will impose some costs on the Commission development and maintenance of a Statewide self-exclusion database (already built), however it is anticipated that these costs are minimal because the Commission will be using existing technology without the need for additional resources. The rules will not impose any additional costs on local governments.

(c) The information, including the source or sources of such information, and methodology upon which the cost estimate is based: The costs associated with the Statewide self-exclusion database will be based on the Commission’s administrative costs associated with building and maintaining the database.

5. **LOCAL GOVERNMENT MANDATES:** These rules do not impose any mandatory program, service, duty, or responsibility upon local government because intake of self-excluded people is strictly a matter of State law.

6. **PAPERWORK:** These rules are not expected to impose any significant paperwork requirements for gaming facility employee and vendor applicants other than the paperwork necessary for the application submission and investigation.

7. **DUPLICATION:** The rules do not duplicate, overlap or conflict with any existing State or federal requirements.

8. **ALTERNATIVES:** The Commission considered maintaining the self-exclusion limitation to only particular forms of gaming, but concluded that self-excluded persons would be better served by being prevented from participating in each forms of legalizing gaming.

9. **FEDERAL STANDARDS:** There are no federal standards applicable to the submission of casino fees and payments. It is purely a matter of New York State law.

10. **COMPLIANCE SCHEDULE:** The Commission anticipates that affected parties will be able to achieve compliance with these rules upon adoption.

Regulatory Flexibility Analysis, Rural Area Flexibility Analysis and Job Impact Statement

A regulatory flexibility analysis for small business and local governments, a rural area flexibility analysis, and a job impact statement are not required for this rule making proposal because it will not adversely affect small businesses, local governments, rural areas or jobs.

The proposal revises the Commission’s self-exclusion rules and procedures and re-codifies certain provisions in regard to restrictions on account wagering on horse racing.

This rule will not impose an adverse economic impact or reporting, record keeping or other compliance requirements on small businesses in rural or urban areas or on employment opportunities. No local government activities are involved. This proposal will not adversely impact small businesses, local governments, jobs or rural areas. It does not require a Regulatory Flexibility Analysis (for Small Businesses and Local Governments), Rural Area Flexibility Analysis or Job Impact Statement.

Food Service Establishments

PURSUANT TO THE PROVISIONS OF THE State Administrative Procedure Act, NOTICE is hereby given of the following proposed rule:

Proposed Action: Amendment of Part 14 of Title 10 NYCRR.

Statutory authority: Public Health Law, sections 225(4) and 201(1)

Subject: Food Service Establishments.

Purpose: To restrict the use of liquid Nitrogen and Dry Ice in food preparation.

Text of proposed rule: New sections 14-1.89 is added to read as follows:

14-1.89 Use of Liquid Nitrogen and Dry Ice.

For the purposes of this section, liquid Nitrogen shall mean Nitrogen in its cryogenic liquid form, which comes in direct contact with food or is used as a food additive. Dry Ice shall mean Carbon Dioxide in its solid form, which comes in direct contact with food or is used as a food additive.

(a) Only food-grade liquid Nitrogen or Dry Ice may be added to food.

(b) Liquid Nitrogen, used in the preparation of food, shall be evaporated completely or the operator shall ensure that all residual liquid Nitrogen is drained prior to service.

(c) Dry Ice, used in the preparation of food, shall be sublimated completely prior to service or the operator shall ensure no residual Dry Ice is served to the patrons.

(d) Liquid Nitrogen or Dry Ice shall not be added to any food before service, such that a “fog” or “smoke” effect remains at time of service or is created during eating.

Section 14-2.3 is amended to include a new subdivision (g) to read as follows:

(g) For the purposes of this subdivision, liquid Nitrogen shall mean Nitrogen in its cryogenic liquid form, which comes in direct contact with food or is used as a food additive. Dry Ice shall mean Carbon Dioxide in its solid form, which comes in direct contact with food or is used as a food additive.

(1) Only food-grade liquid Nitrogen or Dry Ice may be added to food.

(2) Liquid Nitrogen, used in the preparation of food, shall be evaporated completely or the operator shall ensure that all residual liquid Nitrogen is drained prior to service.

(3) Dry Ice, used in the preparation of food, shall be sublimated completely prior to service or the operator shall ensure no residual Dry Ice is served to the patrons.

(4) Liquid Nitrogen or Dry Ice shall not be added to any food before service, such that a “fog” or “smoke” effect remains at time of service or is created during eating.

New section 14-4.96 is added to read as follows:

14-4.96 Use of Liquid Nitrogen and Dry Ice.

For the purposes of this section, liquid Nitrogen shall mean Nitrogen in its cryogenic liquid form, which comes in direct contact with food or is used as a food additive. Dry Ice shall mean Carbon Dioxide in its solid form, which comes in direct contact with food or is used as a food additive.

(a) Only food-grade liquid Nitrogen or Dry Ice may be added to food.

(b) Liquid Nitrogen, used in the preparation of food, shall be evaporated completely or the operator shall ensure that all residual liquid Nitrogen is drained prior to service.

(c) Dry Ice, used in the preparation of food, shall be sublimated completely prior to service or the operator shall ensure no residual Dry Ice is served to the patrons.

(d) Liquid Nitrogen or Dry Ice shall not be added to any food before service, such that a “fog” or “smoke” effect remains at time of service or is created during eating.

New section 14-5.46 is added to read as follows:

14-5.46 Use of Liquid Nitrogen and Dry Ice.

For the purposes of this section, liquid Nitrogen shall mean Nitrogen in its cryogenic liquid form, which comes in direct contact with food or is used as a food additive. Dry Ice shall mean Carbon Dioxide in its solid form, which comes in direct contact with food or is used as a food additive.

(a) Only food-grade liquid Nitrogen or Dry Ice may be added to food.

(b) Liquid Nitrogen, used in the preparation of food, is to be drained or allowed to evaporate completely prior to vending.

(c) Dry Ice, used in the preparation of food, shall be sublimated completely or removed prior to vending.

(d) Liquid Nitrogen or Dry Ice shall not be added to any food before service, such that a “fog” or “smoke” effect remains at time of service or is created during eating.

This rule was not under consideration at the time this agency submitted its Regulatory Agenda for publication in the Register.

Regulatory Impact Statement

Statutory Authority:

The New York State Public Health and Health Planning Council is authorized by New York State Public Health Law (PHL) Section 225(4) to establish, amend and repeal sanitary regulations known as the Sanitary Code of the State of New York (Sanitary Code), subject to approval by the Commissioner. PHL Section 201(1)(m) authorizes the New York State Department of Health (Department) to supervise and regulate the sanitary aspects of public eating and drinking establishments.

Legislative Objectives:

This rulemaking is in accordance with the legislative objective of PHL Sections 225(4) and 201(1)(m) authorizing the PHHPC, in conjunction with the Commissioner of Health, to protect public health and safety through the regulation of the sanitary aspects of Food Service Establishments. In accordance with this objective, the proposed amendments prohibit Food Service Establishment operators from using liquid Nitrogen or Dry Ice at the point of sale to protect the health and safety of New Yorkers patronizing Food Service Establishments.

Needs and Benefits:

The Department is aware of new trends in food service that utilize liquid Nitrogen and Dry Ice at the point of sale. Using liquid Nitrogen and Dry Ice at the point of sale of food products may cause serious injury if the consumer touches or consumes the residual liquid Nitrogen or Dry Ice.

One of these food trends is commonly referred to as “Dragon’s Breath.” Dragon’s Breath is made by pouring liquid Nitrogen over cereal puffs, popcorn or other similar foods, immediately before serving. The liquid Nitrogen (boiling point: -320°F) super cools the food which is then served in a cup with a skewer to be used to remove the puffs from the cup. When chewed the cold food condenses the moisture in the consumer’s breath creating the appearance of breathing smoke. The Department identified reports of injuries associated with Dragon’s Breath, including a 14-year old girl in Florida who suffered frost bite after touching liquid nitrogen in the cup, and a boy in Korea who suffered severe gastrointestinal injuries after drinking residual liquid Nitrogen. More recently, an incident was reported where a boy in Florida suffered an asthma attack which may have been triggered by consuming Dragon’s Breath. In September 2018, the Department received its first complaint of injury from liquid Nitrogen from a food product served in a New York State food service establishment. An 11-year old boy in Victor, NY reportedly experienced oral bleeding and burning sensation shortly after consuming Dragon’s Breath from a mall food service.

Currently, at least three local health departments in New York State have enacted local laws prohibiting the use of liquid Nitrogen at food service establishments and others are exploring similar actions. The US Food and Drug Administration (FDA), on August 30, 2018, issued a Consumer Advisory, advising consumers to avoid eating, drinking or handling foods prepared with liquid Nitrogen at the point of sale, citing the potential for injuries such as those described above. Consequently, the Department is proposing to amend Part 14 to prevent consumers of Food Service Establishments from coming into contact with liquid Nitrogen or Dry Ice added at the point of sale of the food product.

Liquid Nitrogen is an FDA approved food additive and has various uses in the food service industry. Not all these uses of liquid Nitrogen have the potential for accidental service of liquid Nitrogen to the customer. Therefore, the proposed regulation amendment only pertains to the use of liquid Nitrogen just prior to service of the food product to the customer, to prevent accidental service of residual liquid Nitrogen.

The proposed amendment also restricts the use of Dry Ice (solid carbon dioxide) in foods at the point of service. Like liquid Nitrogen, Dry Ice is an approved food additive that is widely available and can be used to create a fog effect in foods. Dry Ice has a sublimation temperature of -109°F and, if touched or consumed in solid form, presents a risk of thermal injury like that of liquid Nitrogen. If the use of liquid Nitrogen is restricted without similar restrictions for Dry Ice, operators may use Dry Ice as a substitute ingredient.

Costs:

Cost to Regulated Parties:

The proposed amendments will impose minimal if any additional costs to regulated parties. Menu boards and signs may need to be updated to remove products that require the use of liquid Nitrogen or Dry Ice at point of sale. A small number of businesses which specialize in Dragon’s Breath may be required to cease operating or modify their business to include other food items.

Cost to State and Local Governments:

There are no direct costs to State or Local Governments associated with the proposed amendments as the State and Local Governments are currently inspecting Food Service Establishments.

Local Government Mandates:

The proposed amendments do not impose any new mandates, duties or responsibilities on any county, city, town, village, school district, fire district or special district. City and County health departments already enforce Part 14 therefore health department staff will incorporate the proposed amendment as part of their existing program responsibilities.

Paperwork:

Adoption of this regulation does not impose any new paperwork requirements for regulated parties or State or local health departments.

Duplication:

The proposed amendments do not duplicate existing State or Federal requirements.

Alternatives:

The Department considered two alternatives to the proposed amendments. The first was to propose no regulatory change but recognize that local health departments may adopt more stringent requirements through local laws or regulations. The second alternative included amending Part 14 of the State Sanitary Code to incorporate the requirements of the Department’s previously issued guidance that require operators to maintain a written safety plan for the use of liquid Nitrogen, approved by the permit-issuing-official, with an additional requirement of providing a written consumer advisory be conspicuously posted at the point(s) of sale and service.

Both alternatives are inconsistent with FDA guidance to avoid consuming products with liquid Nitrogen added at the point of service. They also create a paperwork burden for operators and local health departments staff.

Federal Standards:

Nitrogen is an approved food additive and there are no Federal regulations restricting the use of liquid Nitrogen in food service establishments. The FDA does not have any direct regulatory authority over retail food operations. However, the FDA’s consumer advisory warning to not eat foods with liquid Nitrogen added at the point of service establishes a clear federal position that the practice is considered unsafe.

Compliance Schedule:

The proposed amendments will become effective upon publication of a Notice of Adoption in the State Register.

Regulatory Flexibility Analysis

Effect of Rule:

While many of New York State’s food service establishments are considered small businesses, none of the amendments are directed solely at small businesses. The rule will apply to all 100,000 regulated food service establishments operating in New York State, although the vast majority of establishments do not use liquid Nitrogen or Dry Ice in the preparation of food. These establishments are already required to comply with the food safety provisions of Part 14. The proposed amendments will not result in significant costs to comply for regulated parties and none of the proposed amendments will apply solely to small businesses. A small number of businesses which specialize in Dragon’s Breath may be required to cease operating or modify their business to include other food items.

Local Health Departments are already responsible for overseeing the food service operations of New York State, so there will not be a significant effect on local governments.

Compliance Requirements:

Small businesses must comply with the proposed regulation by not utilizing liquid Nitrogen or Dry Ice in food products at the point of sale. The proposed amendments do not create any new reporting or record keeping requirements.

Professional Services:

The proposed amendments do not create a need for regulated parties to seek any professional services.

Compliance Costs:

The proposed amendments will impose minimal, if any additional, costs to regulated parties. Menu boards and signs may need to be updated to remove products that require the use of liquid Nitrogen or Dry Ice at point of sale. A small number of businesses which specialize in Dragon’s Breath may be required to cease operating or modify their business to include other food items.

Cost to State and Local Governments:

There are no direct costs to Local Governments associated with the proposed amendments as Local Governments are currently inspecting Food Service Establishments.

Economic and Technological Feasibility:

The proposed amendments do not require any new technology and have a negligible economic impact.

Minimizing Adverse Impact:

The regulations currently allow for a waiver to be granted at the discretion of the permit-issuing official, provided that alternative arrangements are made to protect the health and safety of the public.

Small Business and Local Government Participation:

The proposed amendments implement a recommendation received from the New York State Association of County Health Officials. When considering regulatory alternatives, the Department also sought input from the New York State Restaurant Association.

Rural Area Flexibility Analysis

No rural area flexibility analysis is required pursuant to Section 202-bb(4)(a) of the State Administrative Procedure Act. The proposed amendment does not impose an adverse impact on facilities in rural areas, and it does not impose reporting, record keeping or other compliance requirements on facilities in rural areas.

Job Impact Statement

Nature of Impact:

The addition of Liquid Nitrogen and Dry Ice to food products at the point of service is a new novelty trend at food service operations. The proposed regulation’s prohibition on the use of liquid Nitrogen and Dry Ice at the point of sale is expected to have no job impact on the majority of Food Service Establishments where such food products are not the focus of the business, as these food products make up only a small percentage of their sales. Businesses that specialize in or solely sell this type of product may be required to cease operating or modify their business to include other food items. We do not have an accurate estimate of the number of Food Service Establishments affected since there is no registration requirement for the use of liquid Nitrogen or Dry Ice, however the number is expected to be small.

Categories and Numbers Affected:

The main category affected by this regulation is the Food Service Establishment that focuses its primary business on the sale of novelty foods that have liquid Nitrogen or Dry Ice added to them at the point of sale. Because of the lack of data about the number of food establishments that sell these types of food products, it is not possible to accurately estimate the number of jobs affected, however the number is expected to be small.

Regions of Adverse Impact:

The Department anticipates any jobs or employment impacts will occur equally throughout the regions of the state.

Minimizing Adverse Impact:

The Department will consider different types/levels of enforcement while retailers adapt to the new regulation.

Establish Standards for Providers Who Wish to Become Licensed Children’s Mental Health Rehabilitation Programs

I.D. No. OMH-47-18-00003-P

PURSUANT TO THE PROVISIONS OF THE State Administrative Procedure Act, NOTICE is hereby given of the following proposed rule:

Proposed Action: Amendment of Part 511 of Title 14 NYCRR.

Statutory authority: Mental Hygiene Law, sections 7.09, 31.04, 43.02; Social Services Law, sections 364(3), 364-a(1) and 364-j

Subject: Establish standards for providers who wish to become licensed Children’s Mental Health Rehabilitation programs.

Purpose: This regulation provides a vehicle for implementing the new State Plan services.

Substance of proposed rule (Full text is posted at the following State website: https://www.omh.ny.gov/omhweb/policy_and_regulations/): The Children’s Mental Health Rehabilitation Program (CMHRS) is an outgrowth of the Children’s Medicaid Redesign efforts. From this effort, a new array of children’s behavioral health services was designed to better meet the needs of children and their families. A large part of the redesign was focused on making services, known to work well, more readily avail-

able to a broader population of children. As such, services that once were only accessible through a Home and Community Based Services (HCBS) Waiver for children at risk of hospitalization, were developed as State Plan services for all children eligible for Medicaid. Furthermore, the services were included as a part of Early, Periodic, Screening Diagnostic and Treatment (EPSDT) services, directed to all children under the age of 21 years of age as long as they were in need of the service(s) and met medical necessity. This offers a greater opportunity to achieve the goal of integrated care of behavioral health services with physical health care, and the chance to intervene earlier in the lives of children in a more preventive and proactive way.

The Children's Medicaid Redesign involved a variety of child-serving State Agencies, including the Office of Mental Health (OMH), the Department of Health (DOH), the Office of Children and Family Services (OCFS), the Office of Alcoholism and Substance Abuse Services (OASAS), and the Office of Persons with Developmental Disabilities (OPWDD). For these new State Plan services, three agencies: OMH, OASAS, and OCFS, created mechanisms to designate and license/certify agencies for the provision of these services to the populations for which they are responsible.

As a result, the OMH developed the CMHRS program as a vehicle for the implementation of the new State Plan services for children with mental health needs. Providers who become licensed as a CMHRS program will be responsible for the provision and coordination of five of the new State Plan services, including: Other Licensed Practitioner, Community Psychiatric Supports and Treatment, Psychosocial Rehabilitation, Family Peer Support, Services, and Youth Peer Support and Training. This regulation provides a new licensure category for existing children's mental health providers or other interested service providers to become a CMHRS program. In addition, it establishes standard expectations and oversight parameters for all CMHRS program providers.

The goal of the CMHRS program is to assist children and their families with significant mental health and behavioral needs function successfully within their homes and community, ameliorate mental health symptoms, and prevent the progression of mental health conditions by providing a coordinated array of clinical treatment, rehabilitative and support services. The CMHRS program is delivered by a team of varied specialists who works with the child and family to create an individualized treatment plan to meet the unique needs of the child and their family. CMHRS can be offered individually or as a comprehensive array of services provided in an integrated and coordinated manner. Services are intended to be provided in nontraditional settings, including in the home or community settings, to children and their families for whom a flexible approach to service provision is needed to facilitate engagement or therapeutic benefit.

With the CMHRS program, children will have a wider array of available community-based services to assist them at any time in their developmental trajectory when needs are identified. These services provide additional options for families beyond office-based therapy to better meet their needs. It is expected that earlier interventions with greater access to services will help to avert future need for more restrictive services, such as inpatient hospitalizations or residential treatment.

Regulatory Impact Statement

1. Statutory Authority: Sections 7.09 and 31.04 of the Mental Hygiene Law grant the Commissioner of Mental Health the authority and responsibility to adopt regulations that are necessary and proper to implement matters under his or her jurisdiction.

2. Legislative Objectives: Articles 7 and 31 of the Mental Hygiene Law reflect the Commissioner's authority to establish regulations regarding mental health programs.

3. Needs and Benefits: Federal law requires state Medicaid programs to offer Early and Periodic Screening, Diagnosis and Treatment (EPSDT) to all Medicaid-eligible children under age 21. Within the scope of EPSDT benefits, states are required to cover any service that is medically necessary to "correct or ameliorate a defect, physical or mental illness, or a condition identified by screening" and which are recommended by a licensed practitioner of the healing arts. New York State has obtained an amendment to its Medicaid State Plan that authorizes the provision of six new children's behavioral and health services under the EPSDT program. When recommended by a practitioner of the healing arts, these six services will be made available to any child eligible for Medicaid who meets relevant medical necessity criteria, and include: Crisis Intervention Services; Family Peer Support Services (FPSS); Youth Peer Support and

Training (YPST); Psychosocial Rehabilitation Services (PSR); Community Psychiatric Support and Treatment (CPST); and Other Licensed Practitioner (OLP). This Part establishes standards specifically the services offered through the Child Mental Health Rehabilitation Services (CMHRS) Program, which includes OLP, CPST, PSR, FPSS, and YPST, that require additional certification standards that are applicable to all providers of services licensed or operated by the Office of Mental Health that wish to be designated, or have been designated, to offer EPSDT behavioral health services.

4. Costs: Costs to implement a CMHRS Program in general, are significantly offset by the cost savings that can result from its use. These services will be provided in the home or community settings with the goal of identifying needs early, maintaining the child at home with support and services, and preventing longer term need for costly higher-end services. All services are intended to be delivered in a culturally competent manner and to be trauma-informed. Service planning will consider the child and his or her family's strengths, assets, needs and any history of adverse experiences.

(a) Cost to State Government: There are no new costs to State government as a result of these amendments.

(b) Cost to Local Government: There are no new costs to local government as a result of these amendments.

(c) Cost to Regulated Parties: For providers that wish to offer these services, there are no new costs to providers as a result of these amendments.

5. Local Government Mandates: The provision of this service is not required.

These regulatory amendments will not involve or result in any additional imposition of duties or responsibilities upon county, city, town, village, school, or fire districts.

6. Paperwork: For providers that wish to provide this service, written plans must be submitted for approval by the Office.

7. Duplication: These regulatory amendments do not duplicate existing State or federal requirements.

8. Alternatives: OMH wishes to advance these amendments to establish basic standards for the provision of CMHRS Programs to ensure quality and efficacy.

9. Federal Standards: There are currently no federal standards specific to the provision of these EPSDT behavioral health services. However, the regulatory amendments are consistent with the definition of EPSDT services issued by the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services. (42 U.S.C. §§ 1396d(r)(5)).

10. Compliance Schedule: The amendments would be effective upon adoption.

Regulatory Flexibility Analysis

The amendments to 14 NYCRR Part 511-2 are intended to establish basic standards for all licensed providers of services licensed or operated by the Office of Mental Health that wish to be designated, or have been designated to establish a Children's Mental Health Rehabilitation Services Program. The provision of this program is not required, and does not create new local government mandates. As there will be no adverse economic impact on small businesses or local governments as a result of these amendments, a regulatory flexibility analysis is not submitted with this notice.

Rural Area Flexibility Analysis

The amendments to 14 NYCRR Part 511-2 are intended to establish basic standards and parameters to approve the Children's Mental Health Rehabilitation Services Programs that are authorized and designated to provide these services. The provision of these services is not required. The proposed rule will not impose any adverse economic impact on rural areas; therefore, a Rural Area Flexibility Analysis is not submitted with this notice.

Job Impact Statement

The amendments to 14 NYCRR Part 511-2 are intended to establish basic standards and parameters to approve the use of EPSDT behavioral health children's services in Children's Mental Health Rehabilitation Services Programs that are authorized and designated to provide these services. The provision of these services is not required. In addition to facilitating cable competition in certain areas, the proposed franchise agreement would promote broadband deployment at speeds up to 100Mbps and potentially lead to additional network build-out opportunities.

In connection with the proposed cable television franchise, Frontier requested waivers and/or partial waivers of certain cable franchise requirements found in 16 NYCRR § 895.5(b)(1) and 895.5(c) (requiring a five-year build-out of the primary service area); and 16 NYCRR § 895.5(b)(3) and 890(b)(1) (establishing a seven-business day installation interval for providing service to certain dwellings).

Frontier submits that, in light of market realities, the waivers are necessary for new entrants to the market, like Frontier, to compete against well-entrenched cable providers that have existing customer bases and substantially higher market capitalizations than Frontier. Frontier's request proposes exceptions to the area served/ market penetration and installation interval requirements to mitigate the risks and challenges associated with competing with the sole incumbent service provider with a 100% market share.

Frontier has requested of and received from the Commission similar treatment in other cable television franchise agreement proceedings, situated in Frontier's telecommunications footprint, under the provisions of Public Service Law § 215, 216 and 221.

The Estimating Performance Metric requires that NMPC would incur a negative revenue adjustment of \$1 million if more than 20 percent of its distribution or sub-transmission capital projects varied from their respective final engineering cost estimates by more than 10 percent. The indicated negative revenue adjustment increases to \$2 million if the costs

of 30 percent of NMPC's projects fall outside the 10 percent threshold, and \$4 million if the costs of 40 percent of NMPC's projects fall outside the threshold.

Under the provisions applicable to the Estimating performance metric, NMPC may "request exceptions for discrete projects where there are scope changes or significant circumstances." On October 11, 2018, NMPC filed a petition requesting authorization to exclude 15 projects from the final determination of their 2017 performance. Specifically, NMPC explains that the projects did not meet the metric's threshold for the following reasons: five projects due to unforeseeable sub-surface conditions; four projects due to customer driven schedule considerations, scope changes or construction issues; three projects due to a change in reimbursement policy after final engineering estimates; and three projects due to several factors related to emergent conditions. Granting of the petition would reduce the applicable negative revenue adjustment from \$4 million to \$2 million.

(j) In addition to the requirements of this Part, the Commissioner of Transportation adopts the following sections and parts of Title 49 CFR with the same force and effect as though herein fully set forth at length, as the standard for classification, description, packaging, marking, labeling, preparing, handling and transporting all hazardous materials, and procedures for obtaining relief from the requirements of this Part, all of the standards, requirements and procedures contained in *Part 107* sections 107.101, 107.105, 107.107, 107.109, 107.111, 107.113, 107.117, 107.121, 107.123, and *Subpart F, and Subpart G*, Part 171, except for section 171.1, and Parts 172 through 199, including appendices, inclusive and Part 397.

Consensus Rule Making Determination

The New York State Department of Transportation (NYSDOT) engages in commercial motor vehicle enforcement activities under the federal Motor Carrier Safety Assistance Program (MCSAP), the regulatory guidelines for which are published in 49 CFR Part 350. MCSAP is a grant program pursuant to federal / state agreement that provides federal financial assistance to states to reduce the number and severity of accidents and hazardous materials incidents involving commercial motor vehicles. The Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration sets the conditions for participation by states and local jurisdictions and promotes the adoption and uniform enforcement of safety rules, regulations, and standards compatible with the federal motor carrier safety regulations and federal hazardous material regulations for both interstate and intrastate motor carriers and drivers. One such condition is that the participating states incorporate hazardous materials regulations in 49 CFR Part 107 Subpart F (Registration of Cargo Tank and Cargo Tank Motor Vehicle Manufacturers, Assemblers, Repairers, Inspectors, Testers, and Design Certifying Engineers) and Subpart G (Registration of Persons Who Offer or Transport Hazardous Materials), which additions to the already incorporated regulations from 49 CFR Part 107 are proposed herein.

Per 49 USCS section 31102, the goal is to ensure that the Secretary, States, local governments, other political jurisdictions, federally recognized Indian tribes, and other persons work in partnership to establish programs to improve motor carrier, commercial motor vehicle, and driver safety to support a safe and efficient surface transportation system by, among other things, adopting and enforcing effective motor carrier, commercial motor vehicle, and driver safety regulations and practices consistent with federal requirements. Per the preceding, NYSDOT has determined that no person is likely to object to the amendment of 17 NYCRR parts as herein proposed, as pursuant to SAPA section 102(11)(b), the rulemaking conforms to non-discretionary statutory provisions in 49 USCS sections 31102 through 31142. The purpose of this rulemaking is to

incorporate by reference into Title 17 NYCRR 820.8 the aforementioned 49 CFR Part 107 Subparts F and G from the 10/1/2013 Title 49 CFR edition. This rulemaking does not represent a change in NYSDOT policy or practice, nor does it impose significant burdens on commercial motor vehicle carriers and drivers.

Job Impact Statement

1. Nature of impact: The proposed rule change to 17 NYCRR 820.8 corrects for omissions in Title 17 NYCRR regulations associated with transportation of hazardous materials by proposing incorporation of Title 49 CFR regulations associated with registration of cargo tank and cargo tank motor vehicle manufacturers, assemblers, repairers, inspectors, testers and design certifying engineers as provided by 49 CFR Part 107 Subpart F, and for omission of regulations associated with registration of persons who offer or transport hazardous materials by proposing incorporation of Title 49 CFR Part 107 Subpart G. It is not expected to have a significant impact on jobs.

2. Categories and numbers affected: Unchanged, as satisfaction of registration requirements at the federal level, an existing mandate, satisfies the provisions of 49 CFR Part 107, Subparts F & G being incorporated by this rulemaking.

3. Regions of adverse impact: Regulatory requirements are not region sensitive. Inspections and reviews are conducted pursuant to Department policy and there is no variance in the methodology across regions. No adverse impact on jobs in any region is anticipated.

4. Minimizing adverse impact: Neither the frequency of inspections nor the basis for NYSDOT enforcement action is expected to change post adoption of the instant rulemaking, so categories and numbers affected remain status quo.

ACTION PENDING INDEX

The action pending index is a list of all proposed rules which are currently being considered for adoption. A proposed rule is added to the index when the notice of proposed rule making is first published in the *Register*. A proposed rule is removed from the index when any of the following occur: (1) the proposal is adopted as a permanent rule; (2) the proposal is rejected and withdrawn from consideration; or (3) the proposal's notice expires.

Most notices expire in approximately 12 months if the agency does not adopt or reject the proposal within that time. The expiration date is printed in the second column of the action pending index. Some notices, however, never expire. Those notices are identified by the word "exempt" in the second column. Actions pending for one year or more are preceded by an asterisk(*).

The New York State Department of State (DOS) is required by Federal regulations to provide timely public notice for the activities described below, which are subject to the consistency provisions of the Federal Coastal Zone Management Act of 1972, as amended.

The applicant has certified that the proposed activities comply with and will be conducted in a manner consistent to the maximum extent practicable with the federally approved New York State Coastal Management Program (NYSCMP). The federal agency's consistency determination and accompanying public information and data are available for inspection at the New York State Department of State offices located at One Commerce Plaza, 99 Washington Avenue, Albany, New York.

In F-2018-1094 (DA), the applicant, U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service (USFWS), Region 5, Ecological Services, New York Field Office, in cooperation with the landowner, Thousand Island Land Trust (TILT), is proposing ecological enhancement of approximately 95 acres of monotypic cattail marsh along the St. Lawrence River. Funding is allocated from the Fish Enhancement, Mitigation, and Research Fund (FEMRF) sourced through a federal grant from the National Fish and Wildlife Foundation (NFWF) as the fund trustee. The work is to be authorized under a U.S. Army Corps of Engineers nationwide permit. The project is intended to promote aquatic habitat connectivity and promote native vegetation diversity within the Barnett Marsh in the Town of Alexandria, Jefferson County, New York and expands upon restoration work accomplished through similar projects across the region.

The project scope consists of excavating approximately 2.5 acres (11,800 cubic yards) of cattail mat to create thirteen pothole wetland features of varying shapes and 4,725 linear feet (3,100 cubic yards) of hydrologically connecting channels, increasing open water aquatic habitat, as well as constructing low, but relatively elevated features or habitat mounds. Displaced material (approximately 3.1 acres or 15,000 cubic yards) would be regraded to construct the habitat mounds. The proposed action aims to improve spawning habitat for northern pike, improve water quality, and provide suitable habitat for wetland dependent birds.

The project site is within a State-designated Significant Coastal Fish and Wildlife Habitat (SCFWH) –Lake of the Isles– which is protected as biologically productive and valuable habitat area for an abundance of fish and wildlife species. In F-2018-1095 (DA), the applicant, U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service (USFWS), Region 5, Ecological Services, New York Field Office, in cooperation with the landowner, Thousand Island Land Trust (TILT), is proposing ecological enhancement of approximately 60.0 acres of monotypic cattail marsh along the Chippewa Creek and the St. Lawrence River. Funding is allocated from the Fish Enhancement, Mitigation, and Research Fund (FEMRF) sourced through a federal grant from the National Fish and Wildlife Foundation (NFWF) as the fund trustee. The work is to be authorized under a U.S. Army Corps of Engineers nationwide permit. The project is intended to promote aquatic habitat connectivity and promote native vegetation diversity within the Chippewa Creek in the Town of Hammond, St. Lawrence County, New York and expands upon restoration work accomplished through similar projects across the region.

The project scope consists of excavating approximately 2.4 acres (11,300 cubic yards) of cattail mat to create thirteen pothole wetland features of varying shapes and 3,500 linear feet (3,100 cubic yards) of hydrologically connecting channels, increasing open water aquatic habitat, as well as constructing low, but relatively elevated features or habitat mounds. Displaced material (approximately 3.3 acres or 15,700 cubic yards) would be regraded to construct the habitat mounds. The proposed action aims to improve spawning habitat for northern pike, improve water quality, and provide suitable habitat for wetland dependent birds.

The project site is within a State-designated Significant Coastal Fish and Wildlife Habitat (SCFWH) –Chippewa Creek Marsh – which is protected as biologically productive and valuable habitat area for an abundance of fish and wildlife species. EXECUTIVE ORDERS

Executive Order No. 188.2: Extending the Protection of School Children From Speeding Vehicles in School Zones Within the City of New York.

WHEREAS, in 2013 I signed into law Chapter 189 of the Laws of 2013, codified at N.Y. Vehicle and Traffic Law § 1180-b, to develop a system to advance school zone highway safety by use of camera technology to record and enforce speeding violations;

WHEREAS, in 2014, I signed into law an amendment to the above-referenced law authorizing the deployment of speed cameras in 140 school zones throughout the City of New York;

WHEREAS, the New York State Senate adjourned the 2018 legislative session without having acted to extend the aforementioned laws, and has yet to return to act on the same, which, without necessary emergency action taken by the NYC Council, NYC Mayor and the Executive, would have ended a program that has demonstratively and successfully protected school children, families and educators through the use of camera technology to record and enforce speeding violations in school zones;

WHEREAS, it is unacceptable to place school children at risk of serious physical harm and death in the very same places where they are to be educated, cared for, and protected, and that such school children have the right to safely access schools for the purposes of education and enrichment;

WHEREAS, based upon the foregoing, the New York State Police and the New York State Department of Transportation believe that the termination of New York City's speed camera program would result in an eminent disaster emergency that places at risk the health and safety of school children, parents, educators, school employees and volunteers within the City of New York, as well as other pedestrians, and will result in a needless increase in pedestrian fatalities and serious injuries;

WHEREAS, New York City schools are now open and have thus experienced a dramatic increase in the number of children and pedestrians in their zones; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor of New York and City Council have taken actions evidencing the local government's belief that children are in imminent danger and that a public safety emergency exist without this respective program;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, ANDREW M. CUOMO, Governor of the State of New York, by virtue of the authority vested in me by the Constitution and Laws of the State of New York, do hereby extend the state of disaster emergency declared pursuant to Executive Order No. 188 and extend all of the terms, conditions, and directives of Executive Order No. 188 for the period from the date that the disaster emergency was declared pursuant to Executive Order No. 188 until November 23, 2018.
