### II. DEPARTMENT REPORTS

**Enforcement** – E. Delaney reported the metrics for new appraiser complaints received from the last board meeting. Of the appraiser continuing education audits, the non-compliance rate is under 10 percent.

**Processing Reports** – J. DeLollo reported the statistics on the processing of appraiser applications. The number of applications has remained consistent between 2018 to present.

**Qualifying Education Update** – M. Mastrobuono reported on the most recent changes to the appraiser assistant education. The education has been reduced from 154 hours to 79 hours, the minimum requirement of the ASC. An update was also provided regarding the May 2019 criteria change which reduced the experience hours for Licensed Residential and Certified Residential Appraisers.

**ASC Compliance Review -**A. Penzabene provided the Board with a general process of the AMC compliance review.

## III. ACTION ITEMS

**Adoption of USPAP** – A motion was made for the Board to adopt the 2020-2021 USPAP. The motion was unanimously approved.

#### IV. NEW ITEMS

**Implementation of AMC Legislation** – C. Disanto presented to the NYS Appraisal Board a proposed amendment to the AMC law which would allow Licensed Home Inspectors or any Licensed Real Estate Salesperson or Broker to be able to do the inspection portion of the appraisal. There are no minimum education requirements regarding inspections that were attached to this proposed addendum to the AMC law. This proposed amendment was not signed by the Governor at the time of the board meeting.
