Notice of Availability of State and Federal Funds

State agencies must specify in each notice which proposes a rule the last date on which they will accept public comment. Agencies must always accept public comment: for a minimum of 60 days following publication in the *Register* of a Notice of Proposed Rule Making, or a Notice of Emergency Adoption and Proposed Rule Making; and for 45 days after publication of a Notice of Revised Rule Making, or a Notice of Emergency Adoption and Revised Rule Making in the *Register*. When a public hearing is required by statute, the hearing cannot be held until 60 days after publication of the notice, and comments must be accepted for at least 5 days after the last required hearing. When the public comment period ends on a Saturday, Sunday or legal holiday, agencies must accept comment through the close of business on the next succeeding workday.

For notices published in this issue:

- the 60-day period expires on July 3, 2022
- the 45-day period expires on June 18, 2022
- the 30-day period expires on June 3, 2022

Be a part of the rule making process!

The public is encouraged to comment on any of the proposed rules appearing in this issue. Comments must be made in writing and must be submitted to the agency that is proposing the rule. Address your comments to the agency representative whose name and address are printed in the notice of rule making. No special form is required; a handwritten letter will do. Individuals who access the online *Register* (www.dos.ny.gov) may send public comment via electronic mail to those recipients who provide an e-mail address in Notices of Proposed Rule Making. This includes Proposed, Emergency Proposed, Revised Proposed and Emergency Revised Proposed rule makings.

To be considered, comments should reach the agency before expiration of the public comment period. The law provides for a minimum 60-day public comment period after publication in the *Register* of every Notice of Proposed Rule Making, and a 45-day public comment period for every Notice of Revised Rule Making. If a public hearing is required by statute, public comments are accepted for at least five days after the last such hearing. Agencies are also required to specify in each notice the last date on which they will accept public comment.

When a time frame calculation ends on a Saturday or Sunday, the agency accepts public comment through the following Monday; when calculation ends on a holiday, public comment will be accepted through the following workday. Agencies cannot take action to adopt until the day after expiration of the public comment period.

The Administrative Regulations Review Commission (ARRC) reviews newly proposed regulations to examine issues of compliance with legislative intent, impact on the economy, and impact on affected parties. REVISED RULE MAKING NO HEARING(S) SCHEDULED

Part 115 — Personal Cultivation of Cannabis

I.D. No. OCM-46-21-00010-RP

PURSUANT TO THE PROVISIONS OF THE State Administrative Procedure Act, NOTICE is hereby given of the following revised rule:

Proposed Action: Addition of Part 115 to Title 9 NYCRR.

Statutory authority: Cannabis Law, sections 13, 41 and 43; Penal Law, section 222.15

Subject: Part 115 — Personal Cultivation of Cannabis.

Purpose: Regulation to authorize the home cultivation of cannabis for certified medical cannabis patients.

Text of revised rule: Pursuant to the authority vested in the Cannabis Control Board by sections 13, 41 and 43 of the Cannabis Law, Subtitle B of Title 9 of the Official Compilation of Codes, Rules and Regulations of the State of New York is hereby amended, and a new Chapter II is added, to be effective upon publication of a Notice of Adoption in the New York State Register, to read as follows:

Chapter II – Rules of the Office of Cannabis Management

Part 115 - Personal Home Cultivation of Medical Cannabis.

Section 115.1 Definitions.

(a) For purposes of this section, the following definitions shall apply:

(1) “Cultivation” means growing, cloning, harvesting, drying, curing, grading, and trimming of the cannabis plant.

(2) “Designated caregiver” means an individual designated by the certified patient. A designated caregiver is twenty-one years of age or older for purposes of this Part.

(3) “Immature cannabis plant” means a non-flowering female can-

nabis plant or a cannabis plant which does not have buds that may be observed by visual examination.

(4) “Mature cannabis plant” means a female plant that has flowered and that has buds that may be observed by visual examination.

(5) “Office” means the New York State office of cannabis management.

(6) “On the grounds” means the external areas of the private residence where the individual resides and has legal rights to use such external areas for their own purposes, including but not limited to, a backyard or any land adjacent to the private residence.

(7) “Personal Home cultivation” means growing, cloning, harvesting, drying, curing, grading, and trimming of cannabis plants for medical use that is subject to Cannabis Law Article 3 and Penal Law Article 222.

(8) “Private residence” means any building or part of a building, or structure designed and occupied for residential purposes, including but not limited to a private home; townhouse; condominium; co-op; apartment; or mobile home. For purposes of this Part, a hospital, hotel, motel, resort, or other similar public accommodation, shall not be considered a private residence, except as may be expressly allowed by the Board.

(9) “Process” or “Processing” means extracting, preparing, treating, modifying, compounding, manufacturing or otherwise manipulating cannabis for use to concentrate or extract its cannabinoids. For purposes of this section, processing does not include growing, cultivation, cloning, harvesting, drying, curing, grinding, or trimming.

(10) “Proportional” means commensurate to the needs of the certified patient.

Section 115.2 Personal Home Cultivation of Medical Cannabis.

(a) Certified patients twenty-one years of age or older may cultivate cannabis for personal use pursuant to Section 115.2 of this Part.

(b) Designated caregivers twenty-one years of age or older, caring for a certified patient either younger than twenty-one years of age or whose physical or cognitive impairments prevent them from cultivating cannabis, may cultivate cannabis for use by such patient, provided that no patient may have more than one designated caregiver grow on their behalf.

(c) The personal home cultivation of medical cannabis may only occur in, or on the grounds of, a person’s private residence.

(d) No certified patient shall plant, cultivate, harvest, dry, process or possess more than three mature cannabis plants and three immature cannabis plants at any one time.

(e) No more than six mature and six immature cannabis plants may be cultivated, harvested, dried, or possessed within any private residence, or on the grounds of any private residence.

(f) No certified patient or designated caregiver shall sell or barter any cannabis seeds, immature cannabis plants, mature cannabis plants, or cannabis, produced by a plant cultivated pursuant to this Part, to any other person. This subdivision does not prohibit the transfer, without compensation, to a certified patient or a designated caregiver twenty-one years of age or older, up to three ounces of cannabis and up to twenty-four grams of concentrated cannabis.

(g) A certified patient or designated caregiver may lawfully possess up to five pounds of personal home cultivated cannabis in their private residence or on the grounds of such person’s private residence per section five of penal law section 222.15.

(h) Except as otherwise approved by the Office, no certified patient or designated caregiver shall process cannabis at home by means of any liquid or gas, other than alcohol, that has a flashpoint below 100 degrees Fahrenheit.

(i) Immature cannabis plants and mature cannabis plants must be stored in a secure location within a private residence or on the grounds of such certified patient or designated caregiver’s private residence; and reasonable measures must be taken to ensure that such plants, and any cannabis cultivated from such plants, is not readily accessible to anyone under the age of 21. Such reasonable measures may include but are not limited to:

(1) conducting cannabis cultivation in an enclosed area, which may not be plainly visible from public view, including from the street of the

private residence or on the grounds of the certified patient or designated caregiver's private residence; and

(2) locking and storing cannabis in a manner that prevents theft, loss, or access, which may include, but are not limited to locks, gates, doors, fences, and other barriers by an unauthorized person, including a person under the age of 21.

(j) Certified patients utilizing a designated caregiver shall identify a single site for cultivation of their medical cannabis.

(k) Designated caregivers growing on behalf of a certified patient may grow up to six cannabis plants for one certified patient. Should a designated caregiver be designated to grow for more than one certified patient at a time, they shall grow a proportional number of plants for each patient. A designated caregiver shall not grow more than twelve cannabis plants.

(l) In addition to the requirements in Section 115.2 of the Part, designated caregivers shall:

(1) keep any cannabis being cultivated for the designated caregiver's certified patient separate from any other cannabis being cultivated, and in a manner that can readily determine to whom such cannabis plants belong;

(2) only receive reimbursement for the actual costs of goods, materials, or utilities for which they have incurred expenses directly related to the cultivation of cannabis for the certified patient, and not receive reimbursement or compensation for their time, knowledge, or expertise;

(3) not sell any cannabis produced by any immature cannabis plant or mature cannabis plant which is or was cultivated for a certified patient, even if the certified patient no longer needs or wants such cannabis; and

(4) only cultivate cannabis at, or on the grounds of, the designated caregiver's private residence or the certified patient's private residence.

(m) No landlord may refuse to lease, or otherwise penalize a certified patient or designated caregiver solely for engaging in medical cannabis activity as authorized by this Part and in accordance with Cannabis Law, except:

(1) if failing to do so would cause the landlord to lose a monetary or licensing related benefit under federal law or regulations; or

(2) if a property has in place a smoke free policy, it is not required to permit the smoking of cannabis products on its premises, provided no restriction may be construed to limit the certified medical use of cannabis.

(n) Section 115.2(k) of this Part does not exempt an individual from being liable for any property damage as outlined in their lease agreement.

Section 115.3 Registered Organization Sale of Medical Cannabis for Home Cultivation

(a) No person or entity shall sell medical cannabis plants or seeds for home cultivation unless it has complied with Article 3 of the Cannabis Law, this Part, any other applicable federal and state rules, regulations and laws as amended for medical cannabis, and is registered or licensed by the Office of Cannabis Management.

(b) Prior to selling medical cannabis for home cultivation, registered organizations shall update standard operating procedures to include activities related to home cultivation and furnish the standard operating procedures to the Office upon request.

(c) Packaging and Labeling requirements. Notwithstanding any other law or regulation, each cannabis plant or package of seeds for sale shall be labeled with an unobstructed and conspicuous label prior to being transported to the dispensing facility or delivered to the patient as follows:

(1) Labeling shall include the following information:

(i) strain name in bold type;

(ii) product type (eg cannabis seeds, cannabis plant);

(iii) potential potency, as confirmed by testing of the parent cannabis plant (THC:CBD levels);

(iv) date of harvest;

(v) unique identification number (UID);

(vi) any pesticides used in the cultivation;

(vii) name of the entity, licensed or registered with the Office, that cultivated the cannabis;

(viii) name of the entity, licensed or registered with the Office, that sold the cannabis, if different from cultivator;

(ix) for seeds, a seed count and net weight must be included on the packaging label in US customary units and metric;

(x) a warning to "keep out of reach of children"; and

(xi) any other information as determined by the Office.

(2) The label shall be printed on or affixed to any package or container that is used to display the cannabis seed or cannabis plant for retail sale.

(3) Packaging shall be in a manner that is not attractive to minors and that preserves the integrity of the cannabis.

(4) Packaging and labeling shall not contain any untruthful or misleading statements including, but not limited to, health or benefit claims.

(d) Transport. Notwithstanding any other law or regulation, a registered organization shall transport medical cannabis for home cultivation in a

manner determined by the Office and shall ensure that the following are provided to the dispensing facility, patient, or designated caregiver receiving the transport or delivery:

(1) written instructions for basic care and environmental considerations for the plants (light, water, temperature controls) and the method for destruction if necessary, such as if the plants develop disease, or die; and

(2) disclosure of any pesticide use in cultivation and a document signed by a duly authorized representative from the registered organization attesting that only pesticides that are registered by the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation or that specifically meet the United States Environmental Protection Agency registration exemption criteria for Minimum Risk Pesticides, and only in accordance with section 325.2(b) of title 6 of the NYCRR have been used;

(e) Storage at the dispensing facilities. Notwithstanding any other law or regulation, all medical cannabis seeds and immature plants shall be:

(1) stored in a secure area or location within the dispensing facility accessible to the minimum number of employees essential for efficient operation, to prevent diversion, theft or loss; and

(2) stored in such a manner as to protect against physical, chemical and microbial contamination and deterioration. However, a registered organization shall not apply any pesticides to live plants at the dispensing facility;

(f) Sales of medical cannabis for home cultivation. Registered organizations shall:

(1) only conduct sales of medical cannabis for home cultivation at their dispensaries or via delivery service to certified patients twenty-one years of age or older or their designated caregivers who are registered with the Office;

(2) sell seeds and immature plants only in quantities determined by the Office in guidance.

(3) provide certified patients or their designated caregivers with a safety insert at the time of sale. The safety insert shall include:

(i) the medical cannabis strain and potential potency;

(ii) information about contraindications;

(iii) warning of adverse effects and/or any potential dangers stemming from the use of medical cannabis;

(iv) instructions for reporting adverse events;

(v) a warning about driving and operation of mechanical equipment while under the influence of medical cannabis;

(vi) information on tolerance, dependence and withdrawal, and substance abuse, how to recognize what may be problematic usage of medical cannabis and how to obtain appropriate services or treatment;

(vii) language stating medical cannabis seeds and plants must be kept secure and out of reach of children;

(viii) language stating that the certified patient, or designated caregiver, may not distribute medical cannabis to anyone else;

(ix) language stating that unwanted, excess, or contaminated medical cannabis must be disposed of in a manner that makes it nonrecoverable beyond reclamation; and

(x) language stating that medical cannabis for home cultivation is not required to be, and has not been, safety compliance tested.

(g) Reporting and recordkeeping. Notwithstanding any other law or regulation, registered organizations shall:

(1) perform seed to sale tracking of medical cannabis for home cultivation and submit seed to sale data from the registered organization's system of record to the Office in a format as determined by the Office;

(2) file electronically with the Office, utilizing a transmission format acceptable to the Office, a record of all medical cannabis seeds or plants that have been sold not later than 24 hours after the cannabis was sold to the certified patient or designated caregiver. The information filed with the Office for medical cannabis sold shall include:

(i) a serial number that will be generated by the dispensing facility for each type of medical cannabis sold to the certified patient or designated caregiver;

(ii) an identification number which shall be provided by the Office, to identify the registered organization's dispensing facility;

(iii) the metric quantity for the medical cannabis for home cultivation sold;

(iv) the patient name, date of birth and gender;

(v) the patient address, including street, city, state, zip code;

(vi) the certified patient's registry identification card number;

(vii) if applicable, designated caregiver's name and registry identification card number;

(ix) the date the medical cannabis was sold by the dispensing facility; and

(x) any other information determined by the Office.

(h) Returns, complaints and adverse events.

(1) Medical cannabis seeds or plants returned to the dispensing facility shall be securely stored separate from working inventory while awaiting disposal and disposed of as determined by the Office.

(2) Registered organizations shall notify the Office within 24 hours of the following;

(i) any adverse events that the registered organization is made aware of;

(ii) any incident involving theft, loss or possible diversion of medical cannabis;

(iii) any suspected or known security breach or other facility event that may compromise public health or safety, or which requires response by public safety personnel or law enforcement;

(iv) any vehicle accidents or incidents occurring during transport of medical cannabis.

(3) Within ten days of the occurrence of one of the events in paragraph (2) of this subdivision, the registered organization shall submit a complete written incident report to the Office detailing the circumstances of the event, any corrective actions taken, and where applicable, confirmation that appropriate law enforcement authorities were notified.

(4) Quarantine any lot of medical cannabis returned or as directed by the Office, and not transport, distribute, dispense or destroy such lot unless prior approval is obtained from the Office.

(5) Submit medical cannabis, samples and manufacturing materials to the Office upon request.

Revised Regulatory Impact Statement

Statutory Authority:

Pursuant to section 13 of the Cannabis Law, the Cannabis Control Board (Board) is vested with the authority to promulgate rules and regulations necessary to effectuate the provisions of the Cannabis Law. Section 41 of the Cannabis Law authorizes the home cultivation of medical cannabis pursuant to any regulations made by the Board and section 43 of the Cannabis Law explicitly empowers the Board to promulgate such regulations. Furthermore, section 222.15 of the Penal Law requires the Office of Cannabis Management (OCM) to issue regulations for home cultivation of cannabis by certified patients and cannabis consumers.

Legislative Objectives:

The Legislative objective of section 41 of the Cannabis Law and section 222.15 of the Penal Law is to expand patient access to cannabis by allowing for the personal cultivation of cannabis by certified medical patients. The proposed regulation will advance this objective by providing certified patients with a cost-effective means of obtaining cannabis through personal cultivation, while creating a set of standards governing the conduct and activities relating to the personal cultivation of cannabis.

Needs and Benefits:

The proposed regulations are necessary to allow certified patients to cultivate their own cannabis within their private residence. The regulations establish minimum standards for the personal cultivation of cannabis. To achieve this, the regulations require certified patients to conduct cannabis cultivation in a secure location at or on the grounds of a certified patient's private residence. The regulations would also impose a duty on patients to take reasonable measures to ensure that cannabis plants, and any cannabis cultivated from such plants, is not readily accessible to anyone under the age of twenty-one. In addition, the proposed regulation authorizes designated caregivers to grow cannabis on behalf of a certified patient that is under twenty-one years old or whose physical or cognitive impairments prevent them from cultivating cannabis. The proposed regulations are also necessary to restrict the processing of cannabis cultivated by certified patients and designated caregivers by prohibiting the use of any liquid or gas, other than alcohol, that has a flashpoint below 100 degrees Fahrenheit. The proposed regulation includes minimum standards for the transport, sale, storage, and documentation of medical cannabis plants and seeds sold by registered organizations for personal home cultivation.

Costs:

Cost to the Regulated Entity:

The proposed regulations do not impose any new cost to any registered organization or other licensees or permittees operating in accordance with the Cannabis Law.

Costs to Local Government:

The proposed regulations do not require local governments to perform any additional tasks; therefore, it is not anticipated to have an adverse fiscal impact.

Costs to the OCM:

The proposed regulations will not result in any additional operational costs to the OCM.

Local Government Mandates:

The proposed regulations will not impose any new programs, services, duties, or responsibilities upon any county, city, town, village, school district, fire district or other special district.

Paperwork:

The proposed regulations will not create any additional paperwork.

Duplication:

Title V of Article 33 of the Public Health Law (Compassionate Care Act) and Part 1004 to Title 10 of the Codes, Rules, and Regulation of the State of New York (NYCRR) currently regulate the Medical Use of Marijuana. Pursuant to section 64 of Chapter 92 of the Laws of 2021, the Compassionate Care Act will be repealed on March 22, 2022, six months after the full Board was created. Moreover, section 62-e of Chapter 92 of the Laws of 2021 sets out that 10 NYCRR Part 1004 shall continue in full force and effect until duly modified or abrogated by the Board.

Alternatives:

The Board is statutorily required to promulgate regulations pursuant to Sections 13.41 and 43 of the Cannabis Law, and Section 222.15 of the Penal Law. In drafting the proposed regulations, one alternative the Board considered was to take a more restrictive approach to the personal cultivation of cannabis and require certified patients and designated caregivers to maintain document of their grow and higher security requirements. However, the Board ultimately determined that such additional requirements would put an undue burden on certified patients and designated caregivers and were not necessary. Requests were made to clarify landlord rights, the term private residence and the rights to cultivate outdoors on private residences. Changes were made to the regulations to clarify landlord rights and private residence as well as include a new definition for "on the grounds" to address outdoor cultivation on private residences. Finally, there was a need to provide guidance for registered organizations regarding labeling, packaging, tracking, sales, storage and reporting to the office for medical cannabis for home cultivation. Where the regulation only addressed such matters for certified patients and designated caregivers previously, the regulation needed to be updated to include the aforementioned requirements for registered organizations.

Federal Standards:

There are currently no federal standards for the home cultivation of cannabis for personal use.

Compliance Standards:

The regulations shall be effective upon publication of the Notice of Adoption in the State Register. However, cultivation of cannabis by any person other than a certified patient or designated caregiver is not authorized until adult-use licensees are authorized to begin selling adult-use cannabis in the State of New York.

Revised Regulatory Flexibility Analysis, Rural Area Flexibility Analysis and Job Impact Statement

Nothing in the document has changed since the previously published version.

Assessment of Public Comment

The New York State Office of Cannabis Management (the "Office") received over 160 comments in response to the proposed rulemaking adding a new Part 115 to Title 9 of the Code, Rules and Regulations of the State of New York relating to address home cultivation of medical cannabis. Public comments were received from industry stakeholders, including retailers, the general public, and industry associations. The comments covered almost every aspect of the proposed regulation, including limits on the number of cannabis plants, security and disposal requirements, cultivation processes, and cannabis testing.

Many commenters expressed concern regarding plant limits. Additionally, commenters sought clarification regarding the definition of private residence, source of cannabis for home cultivation, sale of home-cultivated cannabis products, security requirements and odor mitigation. Commenters also expressed concerns with the impact that regulations will have on landlord rights and their ability to protect properties from any damage resulting from home cultivation. Commenters also sought clarification regarding the terms "immature" and "mature", as well as the term "grinding" in the definition of "processing".

As a result of these public comments, the Office has amended the proposed regulation and is issuing a Notice of Revised Rulemaking.

Text of proposed rule: Clause (d) of subparagraph (iv) of paragraph (1) of subdivision (a) of section 415.2 of Title 18 NYCRR is amended to read as follows:

(d) the family has income at or below [2]300 percent of the applicable [S]state income standard, *provided the family income does not exceed 85 percent of the state median income*. This child care guarantee is available to eligible families for 12 months from the month after the family's eligibility for public assistance has terminated or ended. Families may ask for and begin to receive child care in any month during the 12-month period of the child care guarantee. The start date for eligibility may precede the date services were requested and cover any period during the 12 months of the guarantee.

Subparagraph (iv) of paragraph (2) of subdivision (a) of section 415.2 of Title 18 NYCRR is amended to read as follows:

(iv) A family with income up to [2]300 percent of the [S]state income standard, *provided the family income does not exceed 85 percent of the state median income* when the family is at risk of becoming dependent on public assistance and child care services are needed:

Subparagraph (v) of paragraph (2) of subdivision (a) of section 415.2 of Title 18 NYCRR is amended to read as follows:

(v) A family experiencing homelessness, in accordance with section 725 of Subtitle VII-B of the McKinney-Vento Act, with income up to [2]300 percent of the [S]state income standard, *provided the family income does not exceed 85 percent of the state median income*, and child care services are needed for the child's caretaker(s) to seek housing and:

- (a)...

Subparagraph (iii) of paragraph (3) of subdivision (a) of section 415.2 of Title 18 NYCRR is amended to read as follows:

(iii) a family receiving public assistance or with income up [2]300 percent of the [S]state income standard, *provided the family income does not exceed 85 percent of the state median income*, when child care services are needed for the child to be protected because the child's caretaker is:

- (a)...
- (b)...

Subparagraph (iv) of paragraph (3) of subdivision (a) of section 415.2 of Title 18 NYCRR are amended to read as follows:

(iv) a family is receiving public assistance or has income up to [2]300 percent of the [S]state income standard, *provided the family income does not exceed 85 percent of the state median income*, and child care services are needed for the child's caretaker to attend a two- year program other than one with a specific vocational sequence leading to an associates degree or a certificate of completion, or a four year college or university program leading to a bachelor's degree provided:

- (c) ...

Subparagraph (vi) of paragraph (3) of subdivision (a) of section 415.2 of Title 18 NYCRR is amended to read as follows:

(vi) a family with income up to [2]300 percent of the [S]state income standard, *provided the family income does not exceed 85 percent of the state median income*, when child care services are needed for the child to be protected because the child's caretaker is physically or mentally

incapacitated or has family duties away from home necessitating his or her absence;

Subparagraph (vii) of paragraph (3) of subdivision (a) of section 415.2 of Title 18 NYCRR is amended to read as follows:

(vii) a family with income up to [2]300 percent of the [S]state income standard, *provided the family income does not exceed 85 percent of the state median income*, when child care services are needed for the child's caretaker to participate in one of the following activities provided such activity is an allowable activity set forth in the social services district's consolidated services plan or integrated county plan and the district determines that the activity is a necessary part of a plan for the family's self-support:

Subparagraph (viii) of paragraph (3) of subdivision (a) of section 415.2 of Title 18 NYCRR is amended to read as follows:

(viii) a family with income up to [2]300 percent of the [S]state income standard, *provided the family income does not exceed 85 percent of the state median income*, when child care services are needed for the child to be protected because one of the child's caretakers is engaged in work as defined in section 415.1(o)(1) of this Part and the child's other caretaker is physically or mentally incapacitated or has family duties away from home necessitating his or her absence.

Paragraph (2) of subdivision (b) of section 415.2 of Title 18 NYCRR are amended to read as follows:

(2) A social services district may establish in its consolidated services plan or integrated county plan upper income levels above [200]300 percent of the State income standard for families receiving child care services under the title XX provided that the income levels do not exceed [275]375 percent of the State income standard for a family of one or two, [255]355 percent of the State income standard for a family of three, or [225]325 percent of the State income standard for a family of four or more.

Clause (a) of subparagraph (i) of paragraph (1) of subdivision (d) of section 415.2 of Title 18 NYCRR is amended to read as follows:

(a) families with very low income. Very low income is defined as an income level up to [2]300 percent of the [S]state income standard, *provided the family income does not exceed 85 percent of the state median income*;

Regulatory Impact Statement

1) Statutory Authority:

Section 20(3)(d) of the Social Services Law (SSL) authorizes the Commissioner of the New York State Office of Children and Family Services (OCFS) to establish rules, regulations, and policies to carry out OCFS' powers and duties under the SSL.

Section 34(3)(f) of the SSL authorizes OCFS to establish regulations for the administration of public assistance and care within the state.

Section 410-u of the SSL establishes the New York State Child Care Block Grant.

Section 410-w of the SSL delineates which families may be eligible to receive child care assistance funded by the New York State Child Care Block Grant.

2) Legislative Objectives:

This rule implements statutory requirements pursuant to the New York State Fiscal Year 2023 Enacted Budget (Chapter 56 of the Laws of 2022) related to expanding access to child care assistance for eligible families with incomes up to 300% of the state income standard.

3) Needs and Benefits:

This rule is necessary to implement requirements of the New York State Fiscal Year 2023 Enacted Budget which amended SSL § 410-u and § 410-w to require that all districts open new cases up to the maximum financial eligibility level of 300% of the state income standard, provided the family income not exceed 85% of the state median income.

This rule is also necessary to obligate and liquidate funds appropriated to the Block Grant for Child Care, as well as the Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act of 2021, and the American Rescue Plan Act.

This rule will expand eligibility for child care assistance by requiring that all districts open new cases up to the maximum financial eligibility level of 300% of the state income standard, provided the family meets all other relevant eligibility requirements and the family income does not exceed 85% of the state median income.

This rule expands eligibility for child care services funded under Title XX of the Federal Social Security Act to provide access to child care assistance to additional eligible families and continue to achieve the goals of Title XX.

This rule will benefit families and child care providers across New York State by expanding families' access to child care assistance, and thus reimbursement to the providers associated therewith.

4) Costs:

While it is anticipated that expanded eligibility will drive approximately \$620.9M in additional subsidy payments, the existing levels of federal child care grant funding will support the increased caseload and any associated administrative costs. OCFS will allocate additional funds to social services district to provide the additional services. There will be no additional costs borne by the state or the local districts. There will be a cost savings to many families that will be newly eligible for child care assistance due to increased income eligibility limits.

5) Local Government Mandates:

No new mandates are imposed on local governments by this rule. However, the existing rules will apply to a broader range of families. All 58 social services districts will need to update their Child and Family Services Plan (CFSP) to reflect these changes in eligibility.

6) Paperwork:

Currently, all 58 social services districts will need to update their Child and Family Services Plan (CFSP) to reflect changes in eligibility levels. The New York State Office of Children and Family Services (OCFS) will support and assist in this process. OCFS recommends that all social services districts review cases that were previously denied between April 1, 2022 and the adoption of this rule and notify such families of the expansion to eligibility. OCFS is developing means to assist in this process. OCFS' Division of Child Care Services will be available to assist with questions.

7) Duplication:

This rule does not duplicate state or federal requirements.

8) Alternatives:

There are no alternatives. Without this rule, OCFS will not be able to obligate and spend the appropriations under the listed funding streams in a timely manner. OCFS also needs this rule to comply with state statute.

9) Federal Standards:

This rule is consistent with applicable federal requirements.

10) Compliance Schedule:

Compliance with this rule will begin August 1, 2022

Regulatory Flexibility Analysis

1) Effect of Rule:

There are approximately 16,200 licensed/registered child care programs and 17,000 enrolled legally exempt child care programs, and 58 social services districts in New York State affected by this rule.

2) Compliance Requirements:

Currently, all 58 social services districts will need to update their Child and Family Services Plan (CFSP) to reflect changes in eligibility levels. The New York State Office of Children and Family Services (OCFS) will assist in this process. OCFS is recommending that all social services districts review cases that were previously denied between April 1, 2022, and the adoption of this rule and notify such families of the expansion to eligibility. OCFS is developing means to assist in this process. OCFS program staff in the Division of Child Care Services will be available to assist with questions that arise.

3) Professional Services:

Child care programs and local governments will not be required to use or employ any additional professional services as a result of this rule. Social services districts are not required to take additional actions to implement this rule; however, OCFS is recommending districts notify previously denied applicants of the expansion of eligibility due to availability of funding. OCFS is taking steps to mitigate the time required for districts to conduct a case review from April 1, 2022 to the adoption of this rule.

4) Compliance Costs:

There may be additional costs to social services districts associated with the compliance requirements set forth above. Specifically, depending on staffing, there may be a cost associated with district amendments to CFSPs. However, any such costs are expected to be nominal, as OCFS will be assisting with these processes to the greatest extent possible. Furthermore, under section 410-v(2) of the SSL, the State is responsible for reimbursing social services districts for 100 percent of the expenditures for child care services to low-income families funded under the New York State Child Care Block Grant (NYSCCBG), up to the district's allocation under the NYSCCBG. Therefore, social services districts will not experience an increase in local funds needed to account for the expansion of eligibility.

5) Economic and Technological Feasibility:

There are no new requirements that will impact economic and/or technological feasibility.

6) Minimizing Adverse Impact:

OCFS believes there will be minimal adverse impact on child care programs or social services districts. The costs associated with this rule will be provided for in additional allocations.

7) Small Business and Local Government Participation:

OCFS met with stakeholders about the need for child care assistance in the field and the need to obligate the listed funds in accordance with the relevant requirements. OCFS conducted calls with all 58 social services districts between February 14, 2022, and March 24, 2022, including group calls with multiple districts as well as individual calls with each district. OCFS will provide guidance, technical assistance, and outreach to those that are impacted by this rule. Specifically, OCFS will assist social services districts that need to update their CFSP to reflect changes to eligibility. OCFS will also post this information on the OCFS' website, including contact information for questions on this rule and the email address of the regulations' mailbox (regcomments@ocfs.ny.gov) to provide public comments.

Rural Area Flexibility Analysis

1) Types and Estimated Numbers of Rural Areas:

This rule will apply to licensed/registered and enrolled legally exempt child care programs and social services districts in all 44 rural areas of the state.

2) Reporting, Recordkeeping and Other Compliance; and Professional Services:

All 58 social services districts will need to update their Child and Family Services Plan (CFSP) to reflect changes in eligibility. The New York State Office of Children and Family Services (OCFS) will assist in this process.

3) Costs:

There may be additional costs to all social services districts (including those in rural areas) associated with the compliance requirements set forth above. Specifically, depending on staffing, there may be a cost associated with district amendments to CFSPs. However, any such costs are expected to be nominal, as OCFS will be assisting with these processes to the greatest extent possible.

Furthermore, under section 410-v(2) of the SSL, the State is responsible for reimbursing social services districts (including those in rural areas) for 100 percent of the expenditures for child care services to low-income families funded under the New York State Child Care Block Grant (NYSCCBG), up to the district's allocation under the NYSCCBG. Therefore, social services districts (including those in rural areas) will not experience an increase in local funds needed to account for the expansion of eligibility.

4) Minimizing Adverse Impact:

OCFS does not anticipate any adverse impact to rural area child care programs or social services districts as a result of this rule.

5) Rural Area Participation:

OCFS met with stakeholders about the need for child care assistance in the field and the need to obligate the listed funds in accordance with the relevant requirements. OCFS conducted calls with all 58 social services districts between February 14, 2022, and March 24, 2022, which includes those in rural areas. OCFS will provide guidance, technical assistance, and outreach to those that are impacted by this rule. Specifically, OCFS will assist social services districts that need to update their CFSP to reflect changes to eligibility. OCFS will also post this information on the OCFS' website, including contact information for questions on this rule and the email address of the regulations' mailbox (regcomments@ocfs.ny.gov) to provide public comments.

Job Impact Statement

The proposed regulatory amendments will not have a substantial adverse impact on jobs or employment opportunities. Mandatory Face Coverings in OPWDD Settings

PURSUANT TO THE PROVISIONS OF THE State Administrative Procedure Act, NOTICE is hereby given of the following action:

Action taken: Addition of section 633.26 to Title 14 NYCRR.

Statutory authority: Mental Hygiene Law, sections 13.07, 13.09(b) and 16.00

Finding of necessity for emergency rule: Preservation of public health, public safety and general welfare.

Specific reasons underlying the finding of necessity: The emergency adoption of a new section, 14 NYCRR 633.26, that requires face coverings for all staff, volunteers, contractors, vendors, visitors and individuals receiving services when in facilities or providing services that are certified or operated by OPWDD, is necessary to protect the health, safety, and welfare of individuals who receive these services. This regulation must be issued by emergency regulation giving the increasing transmission of COVID-19 despite vaccines being available. OPWDD serves a vulnerable population and as such has a duty to ensure the services provided meet public health and safety standards.

Subject: Mandatory face coverings in OPWDD settings.

Purpose: To protect public health.

Text of emergency rule: A new section 633.26 is added to read as follows:

633.26 Mandatory Face Coverings

(a) Applicability

(1) *This section applies to all agencies providing services or operating facilities that are certified or operated by OPWDD (hereinafter "Providers of Services").*

(b) Legal Basis

(1) *Section 13.07 of the Mental Hygiene Law charges the OPWDD with the responsibility for seeing that persons with developmental disabilities are provided with care and treatment, and that such care, treatment and rehabilitation is of high quality and effectiveness.*

(2) *Section 13.09 of the Mental Hygiene Law gives the commissioner of OPWDD the power and responsibility to adopt regulations that are necessary and proper to implement matters under his or her jurisdiction.*

(3) *Section 16.00 of the Mental Hygiene Law grants the commissioner of OPWDD the power and responsibility to adopt regulations to effectuate the provisions and purposes of article 16 of such law, including procedures for the issuance and amendment of operating certificates, and for setting standards of quality and adequacy of facilities.*

(4) *Section 16.11 of the Mental Hygiene Law authorizes the commissioner of OPWDD to provide for the oversight of facilities and providers of services holding operating certificates pursuant to section 16.03 of this article.*

(c) Mask Wearing Requirements

(1) *All Providers of Services shall require all staff, volunteers, contractors, vendors, visitors and individuals receiving services to wear appropriate face coverings, consistent with any directives issued by OPWDD and consistent with guidance from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC).*

(d) Exemptions From Face Covering Requirements

(1) *Face coverings are not required to be worn by:*

(i) *children under two years of age;*

(ii) *a person with a disability who cannot wear a mask, or cannot safely wear a mask, for reasons related to the disability; or*

(iii) *a person for whom wearing a mask would create a risk to workplace health, safety, or job duty as determined by an Occupational Health and Safety Administration workplace risk assessment.*

(e) Enforcement

(1) *OPWDD will enforce this mandate as part of its oversight activities in accordance with the authority set forth in subsection b of this section.*

This notice is intended to serve only as a notice of emergency adoption. This agency intends to adopt the provisions of this emergency rule as a permanent rule, having previously submitted to the Department of State a notice of proposed rule making, I.D. No. PDD-40-21-00002-EP, Issue of October 6, 2021. The emergency rule will expire June 13, 2022.

Additional matter required by statute: Pursuant to the requirements of the State Environmental Quality Review Act, OPWDD, as lead agency, has determined that the action described herein will have no effect on the environment and an E.I.S. is not needed.

Regulatory Impact Statement

1. Statutory Authority:

a. The Office for People With Developmental Disabilities (OPWDD) has the statutory responsibility to provide and encourage the provision of appropriate programs, supports, and services in the areas of care, treatment, habilitation, rehabilitation, and other education and training of persons with intellectual and developmental disabilities, as stated in the New York State (NYS) Mental Hygiene Law (MHL) Section 13.07.

b. OPWDD has the statutory authority to adopt rules and regulations necessary and proper to implement any matter under its jurisdiction as stated in the NYS MHL Section 13.09(b).

c. OPWDD has the statutory authority to adopt regulations concerned with the operation of programs and the provision of services, as stated in the NYS MHL Section 16.00. The regulation also ensures compliance by OPWDD certified and operated residences with the proper provision of services.

d. OPWDD has the statutory authority to provide for the oversight of facilities and providers of services holding operating certificates, as stated in the NYS MHL Section 16.11.

2. Legislative Objectives: The proposed regulations further legislative objectives embodied in MHL sections 13.07, 13.09(b), and 16.00. The proposed regulation adds Title 14 NYCRR Section 633.26 in order to protect individuals receiving services from providers certified or operated by OPWDD.

3. Needs and Benefits: The proposed regulation adds Title 14 NYCRR Section 633.26 to require face coverings for all staff, volunteers, contractors, vendors, visitors and individuals receiving services when in facilities or providing services that are certified or operated by OPWDD. This regulation is necessary to protect the health, safety, and welfare of individuals who receive services from providers that are certified or operated by OPWDD. This regulation is being proposed due to the increasing transmission of COVID-19 and despite vaccines being available. OPWDD serves a vulnerable population and as such has a duty to ensure the services provided meet public health and safety standards.

4. Costs:

a. **Costs to the Agency and to the State and its local governments:** There is no anticipated impact on Medicaid expenditures as a result of the proposed regulations, as the entities that provide these services will only be providing such services to individual's already receiving Medicaid, in accordance with existing OPWDD policies and processes.

These regulations will not have any fiscal impact on local governments, as the contribution of local governments to Medicaid has been capped. Chapter 58 of the Laws of 2005 places a cap on the local share of Medicaid costs and local governments are already paying for Medicaid at the capped level.

There are no anticipated costs to OPWDD in its role as a provider of services to comply with the new requirements.

b. **Costs to private regulated parties:** There will not be any anticipated costs to regulated providers to comply with the proposed regulations. The regulation requires face coverings for all staff, volunteers, contractors, vendors, visitors and individuals receiving services when in facilities or providing services that are certified or operated by OPWDD. Throughout the past two years there have been various masking requirements for these providers. Therefore, there are no new anticipated costs.

5. Local Government Mandates: This rule would not apply to local government units. There are no new requirements imposed by the rule on any other county, city, town, village; or school, fire, or other special district.

6. Paperwork: Providers will not experience an increase in paperwork as a result of the proposed regulations.

7. Duplication: The proposed regulations do not duplicate any existing State or Federal requirements on this topic.

8. Alternatives: OPWDD did not consider any other alternatives to the proposed regulations. These changes are necessary to protect public health and individuals receiving services from providers certified or operated by OPWDD.

9. Federal Standards: The proposed amendments do not exceed any minimum standards of the federal government for the same or similar subject areas.

10. Compliance Schedule: OPWDD plans to adopt the regulations as an emergency regulation effective upon filing. Following the comment period OPWDD plans to adopt the regulation as permanent. OPWDD expects that providers will be in compliance with the proposed requirements at the time of their effective date(s).

Regulatory Flexibility Analysis

A Regulatory Flexibility Analysis for the proposed regulation is not being submitted because it is apparent from the nature and purpose of the regulation that it will not have a substantial adverse impact on small businesses or local governments.

The proposed regulation adds Title 14 NYCRR Section 633.26 to require all providers certified or operated by OPWDD require face coverings for all staff, volunteers, contractors, vendors, visitors and individuals receiving services when in facilities or providing services that are certified or operated by OPWDD. The regulation will not result in new compliance requirements or additional professional services for providers. There is also no additional paperwork required by the amendment. The regulation is designed to protect individuals receiving services during the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic. A Regulatory Flexibility Analysis for the proposed regulation is not being submitted because it is apparent from the nature and purpose of the regulation that it will not have a substantial adverse impact on small businesses and/or local governments.

Rural Area Flexibility Analysis

A Rural Area Flexibility Analysis for these amendments is not being submitted because the regulation will not impose any adverse impact or significant reporting, record keeping or other compliance requirements on public or private entities in rural areas. There are no professional services, capital, or other compliance costs imposed on public or private entities in rural areas as a result of the proposed regulation.

The proposed regulation adds Title 14 NYCRR Section 633.26 in order to require face coverings for all staff, volunteers, contractors, vendors, visitors and individuals receiving services when in facilities or providing services that are certified or operated by OPWDD. The regulation will not result in an adverse impact on rural communities because the regulation applies to all employees, volunteers, or contractors working at providers who are certified or operated by OPWDD. The proposed regulation will not result in costs for regulated parties. Therefore, the amendments will not have any adverse effects on providers in rural areas and local governments.

Job Impact Statement

A Job Impact Statement for the proposed regulation is not being submitted because it is apparent from the nature and purpose of the regulation that it will not have a substantial adverse impact on jobs and/or employment opportunities.

The proposed regulation adds Title 14 NYCRR Section 633.26 in order to require face coverings for all staff, volunteers, contractors, vendors, visitors and individuals receiving services when in facilities or providing services that are certified or operated by OPWDD. The regulation will result in new compliance requirements for providers. However, throughout the past two years there have been face covering requirements on these types of providers so the compliance measures would be minimal and not overly burdensome. The regulation will not have a substantial impact on jobs or employment opportunities in New York State.

Substance of proposed rule: The Public Service Commission (Commission) is considering a petition (the Petition) filed on February 11, 2022, by the Consolidated Edison Company of New York, Inc. (Con Edison or Company) to use an energy storage resource for wholesale market participation. Con Edison is seeking to bid the output from a Company-owned energy storage system, referred to as the Ozone Park Battery Project (the Storage System), into the New York Independent System Operator, Inc. (NYISO) administered wholesale markets.

In 2014, the Commission approved the Brooklyn Queens Demand Management (BQDM) Program, which directed Con Edison to acquire 41 MW of customer-side distributed energy resources and load-reduction solutions and 11 MW of non-traditional utility-sided solutions. The Storage System was selected to serve the BQDM Program need to reduce peak energy demand during the hottest summer days, and has been in-service since 2019. The Storage System consists of eight containers with 208 lithium-iron phosphate battery modules, has a rated capacity of 2 MW and can produce 10.5MWh of electricity.

The Petition requests that the Commission approve the Company's request to bid the Storage System into the NYISO markets. The Petition describes several benefits for both Con Edison itself and its customers, including that the Company expects to obtain invaluable experience that it anticipates applying to the pending deployment of larger-scale bulk energy storage battery storage projects in its service territory. Additionally, the Petition states that Con Edison would use the net revenue generated from the NYISO markets to directly benefit customers.

According to the Petition, Con Edison personnel are able to operate the Storage System both locally and remotely by means of the Brooklyn Queens Control Center. The Petition also notes that the Company plans to adhere to a weekly energy scheduling plan based on the Storage System's established Summer Operation guidelines. The Petition establishes that the schedule would be based on reliability and system needs and, when not needed for load relief/reliability needs, Con Edison would bid the Storage System into the NYISO markets.

Con Edison proposes filing annual reports with the Commission regarding the results of dispatching the Storage System into the NYISO markets. The first report would be due no later than December 21, 2022.

Subject: Agreement for the provision of water service and waivers.

Purpose: To consider whether the terms of a service agreement and requested waivers are in the public interest.

Saratoga asserts that this waiver is necessary on the grounds that the Agreement would technically be inconsistent with the Commission's regulations that restrict service to customers located within the company's service territory, and as Cramer Woods is outside Saratoga's service area, Saratoga requests a waiver to avoid ambiguity. Saratoga also seeks a waiver of 16 NYCRR § 501.10, which requires water companies to receive permission from DEC to extend their service territory before seeking a waiver of tariff requirements from the Commission.

The petition requests an Order (a) approving the terms and conditions of the Agreement as being in the public interest, (b) determining that the provision of water service by Saratoga, in accordance with the terms set forth in the Agreement, is in the public interest, (c) waiving Saratoga's tariff provisions to the extent they are inconsistent with the Agreement, and (d) waiving the applicability of 16 NYCRR § 501, including § 501.10, and § 502 to the extent they are inconsistent with the Agreement.

The Commission’s regulations at 16 NYCRR § 100.3 provide that a non-residing applicant for electric service must provide a deposit to the utility equal to the estimated cost of construction. The deposit is returned to the applicant, on a pro rata basis, as each lot is sold and new customers take service from the utility. Part 100.3(b) provides that any portion of the deposit remaining unrefunded five years after the date the utility is first ready to render service shall be retained by the utility. National Grid’s electric tariff, PSC 220 Rule 16.6, incorporates the Commission’s regulation. National Grid’s gas tariff, PSC 219, Rule 10.4 provides substantially similar requirements for non-residing applicants requesting the extension of gas facilities.

The deadline for the Development commenced on May 5, 2022, when the first unit was energized. Garrison states that, because of the COVID pandemic, it was unable to conduct sales or construction throughout 2020 and 2021, and requests a waiver of National Grid’s tariff rule and the related Commission regulation to allow for a one year extension of the development period.

Proposed Action: This is a consensus rule making to add sections 720.3, 720.4, 720.11, 721.1, 750.1, 820.1, 820.5; repeal sections 505.12, 505.13, 720.2(a)(1), (3), 720.4(z)(2)(ii), 720.11(g), 721.3(f) and 820.10(o) of Title 17 NYCRR.

Statutory authority: Transportation Law, sections 14, 138, 140, 142, 145; Vehicle and Traffic Law, sections 375, 383, 401, 509-x, 5090y, 1223-a, art. 19-A

Subject: Regulation of commercial motor carriers in New York State.

Purpose: To repeal or modify obsolete provisions, make technical changes, and implement non-discretionary statutory provisions.

Text of proposed rule: Section 505.12 is repealed.

[Notwithstanding the amount of a penalty set forth in the notice of violation, the decision of the presiding officer in a proceeding may be to impose a penalty of up to \$ 5,000, dismiss the notice of violation, or find respondent guilty and impose no monetary penalty.]

Section 505.13 is repealed.

[All penalties imposed shall be paid within 120 days of the date of service of the order, unless an appeal is filed as hereinafter set forth.]

Section 720.2 is amended to repeal (a)(1) and (3):

(a) A motor vehicle subject to department inspection requirements shall not be operated unless it displays on the interior surface of the windshield, as close to the lower right hand corner as practicable, an unexpired certifi-

cate of inspection issued to the current owner or operator by the department, or by another regulatory body certified by the department. In lieu of such certificate of inspection, the department shall recognize the display of a valid certificate of inspection issued within the preceding six months for a motor vehicle having a seating capacity of more than 10 passengers engaged in interstate commerce by the following:

[(1) The Commercial Vehicle Safety Alliance certificate of safety inspection. See Section 720.11(f) of this Part.]

[(3) The Public Service Commission of the State of Delaware.]

Section 720.3 is amended to add subdivision (d):

(d) *Signs and placards. Any motor vehicle having a seating capacity of more than seven passengers and whose primary use is to transport pupil(s) and teachers to and from school shall not be mounted with or have installed thereon any sign, placard, or other display except as permitted by law. The provisions of this subdivision shall not apply to such motor vehicles operating in a city with a population of one million or more.*

Section 720.4(k), (y)(1)(i) and (z) are amended to read as follows:

(k) School bus insulation (Type A, B, C, D). School buses shall have insulation material of a fire-resistant nature placed between the panels from the floor to the top of the roof. The insulating material shall be thermo type and permanently sealed in place. The insides of all exterior and interior panels shall be coated with asphalt base, rubber base or other approved material, [applied by spray method,] in order to seal, deaden sound, insulate and prevent oxidation.

(y) Chassis construction.

(1) General requirements (all vehicles).

(i) FMVSS. All chassis shall meet the applicable FMVSS as of date of manufacture. Compliance with such standards shall be certified by the manufacturer by attachment of a plate or decal. The manufacturer’s GVWR that is not to be exceeded shall be listed on such plate or decal. As necessary, the wet curb weight of the vehicle shall be provided by the final stage manufacturer.

(a) *Stretch limousines.*

(i) *Vehicle that are subject to these safety requirements and that meet the definition of an altered vehicle commonly referred to as a “stretch limousine” may not be operated unless all FMVSS labels, markings and placards required at the time of manufacture are present and conform with the current state of the vehicle.*

(b) *Vans in School Service.*

(i) *Vehicles that are subject to these safety requirements that meet the definition of a school vehicle and that have a seating capacity of more than 10 passengers including the driver may not be operated unless the vehicle was manufactured in accordance with the FMVSS of a school bus.*

(z) Brakes.

(2) School buses (Type B, C, D).

[(ii) Wig-wags. Wig-wags or equivalent audible and movable warning devices shall be mounted as near as practicable to the forward field of vision of the driver when in a normal seated position, and its movement shall not allow contact with other movable or fixed objects attached to the vehicle. If only one audible or movable warning device is used, it shall monitor the wet tank.]

Section 720.11(d)(3) is amended as follows and (g) and section 16.01 is repealed.

(d) Criteria.

(3) Vehicles operated by a carrier determined not to have an acceptable safety and inspection record that have Defect Ratings of “B” and “C” shall be treated as if they had a Defect Rating of “A”. Periodically, the [Passenger and Freight Safety Division] *Office of Modal Safety & Security* shall determine those carriers that do not have an adequate safety and inspection record. Such determinations may be based on a review of the carrier’s past safety record, preventive maintenance program and out-of-service rate.

[(g) Commercial vehicle safety alliance inspection sticker. The sticker is typically placed on the front bumper of the commercial vehicle.]

Drivers of passenger carrying vehicles that carry more than 15 passengers, including the driver, or with a gross vehicle weight rating of more than 10,000 pounds shall comply with the applicable Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations (FMCSR) of the Federal Highway Administration, including: 49 CFR Part 382 - Controlled Substances and Alcohol Use and Testing, part 383 - Commercial Driver's License Standards; Requirements and Penalties, part 390 - Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations; General, subdivisions 391.21, except for (b)(12), 391.23, except for (b) and (c), 391.25, 391.27, except for (c) and (d), 391.41, 391.43 and 391.51, except for (b)(3), (b)(7) and (d)(4), of part 391 - Qualifications of Drivers, part 392 Driving of Commercial Motor Vehicles, part 393 - Parts and Accessories Necessary For Safe Operation, part 396 - Inspection, Repair, and Maintenance, except for subdivisions 396.3(a)(2) and (b)(4) and part 397 - Transportation of Hazardous Materials; Driving and Parking Rules. With respect to commercial drivers that are licensed with a passenger endorsement to operate a bus on an intrastate basis only, parts 390 to 397 shall not apply to commercial drivers when operating a school bus, and the adopted portions of part 391 shall only apply to those drivers that received their initial commercial driver's license after 5/19/1999, the first effective date of this regulation. With respect to hours of service of bus drivers the requirements 17 NYCRR 820.6 of apply.]

Section 750.1 is amended as follows:

Every person, firm, association or corporation operating motor vehicles under certificate of convenience and necessity or permit issued by the Commissioner of Transportation, or his predecessors, and every street railway corporation operating motor vehicles under authority granted by the Commissioner of Transportation, or his predecessors, shall procure and maintain and file with the Commissioner of Transportation surety bonds or certificate of insurance approved as to form by the commissioner in a solvent and responsible company authorized to do business in this State and approved by the Superintendent of [Insurance] *Financial Services*, or qualify as a self-insurer, covering each motor vehicle operated pursuant to such certificate, permit or authority, conditioned for the payment of all claims and judgments for damages or injuries caused in the operation, maintenance, use or the defective construction of such motor vehicle in at least the following amounts:

Passenger vehicles having a carrying capacity of [12] 7 or less passengers: for personal injury or death to one person, \$ 100,000; Personal injury or death to all persons in one accident, \$ 300,000, with a maximum of \$ 100,000 for each person;

Property damage, \$50,000;

Passenger vehicles having a carrying capacity of more than [12] 7 passengers: for personal injury or death to [one] *all persons in one accident*, \$ 1,500,000.

Property damage, \$ 50,000.

Section 820.1 is amended to add (e):

(e) *Operation for repair. Motor carriers who are duly licensed as NYSDMV Inspection/Repair facilities and dealers may operate a commercial motor vehicle that they do not own and that contains no cargo solely for the purpose of conducting a road test in furtherance of repairs to the commercial motor vehicle without having a USDOT registration.*

Section 820.5 is amended as follows:

(a) The Commissioner of Transportation adopts Part 393 of Title 49 of the Code of Federal Regulations with the same force and effect as though herein fully set forth at length.

(b) *Motor carrier information required to be displayed in altered motor vehicles commonly referred to as "stretch limousines". Motor carriers operating altered motor vehicles must conspicuously display the following information in the vehicle and at their business locations: proof of valid operating authority, inspection history data, driver qualifications, toll free hotline and website for complaints. Such information shall be displayed in accordance with the sample documentation provided by the Department.*

Section 820.10(o) is repealed.

[(o) In addition to, or in lieu of, any sanctions set forth in this section, the Commissioner of Transportation may, after a hearing, impose a penalty not to exceed a maximum of \$ 5,000 in any one proceeding upon any person if the commissioner finds that such person or officer, agent or employee thereof has failed to comply with the requirements of this chapter or any rule, regulation or order of the commissioner promulgated thereunder.]

Consensus Rule Making Determination

The Department of Transportation anticipates that no person is likely to object to the proposed rule as written. The proposed rule repeals or modifies obsolete regulatory provisions, makes technical changes, and implements non-discretionary state and federal statutory provisions. The proposed rule will not require motor carriers to comply with any requirement that they are not currently required to comply with. Based on the foregoing, the Department of Transportation believes that the proposed rule is a consensus rule.

Job Impact Statement

The Department has reviewed the potential job impact of this rule-making, and has determined that the amendments to 17 NYCRR will not have a substantial adverse impact on jobs and employment opportunities. It is evident from the subject matter of the rule making that the amendments will not have a substantial adverse impact on jobs and employment. Rather, the amendments seek to implement non-discretionary state and federal statutory provisions and repeal obsolete provisions. By promoting uniformity between state and federal statutes and regulation and repealing out of date provisions, the amendments will have no impact on job opportunities.
