Resolutions of the New York State Cemetery Board for the Adoption of Rules for Natural Organic Reduction

1. The Cemetery Board finds and determines that the adoption of the rule identified in the notice of adoption, renumbering sections 204.1 to 204.14 of title 19 NYCRR to 203.15 to 203.28 of Title 19; adding sections 204.1 to 204.22 to title 19 NYCRR, and renaming Part 204 of title 19 NYCRR to "Natural Organic Reduction," will not have a significant adverse environmental impact or significant adverse impact in an area of an approved local waterfront revitalization program and the Cemetery Board authorizes Mark Pattison as Chairperson to sign on behalf of the Cemetery Board:
 - 1) the SEQRA short environmental assessment form indicating no or a small environmental impact may occur and respond in the negative to each question in part 2 of the form and determine in part 3 of the form that the proposed action will not result in any significant adverse environmental impacts; and
 - 2) to sign the NYS DOS Coastal Management program Coastal Assessment form and Certification of no significant coastal impact.
2. The Cemetery Board adopts as a permanent rule the rule identified in the notice of adoption, renumbering sections 204.1 to 204.14 of title 19 NYCRR to 203.15 to 203.28 of Title 19; adding sections 204.1 to 204.22 to title 19 NYCRR, and renaming Part 204 of title 19 NYCRR to "Natural Organic Reduction." DOS is directed to file a notice of adoption with respect to the rule and the rule shall be effective on the date the rule is published in the state register.
