26-03-A-13 – Minutes of Previous Meetings

26-03-B-14 – Legislation and Regulation

1. Pending Legislation

Division Counsel Robert Vanderbles referred the Board to the published Legislative Report.

2. Regulations

Mr. Vanderbles reported on draft rule revisions currently in the works. We are drafting a notice of proposed rulemaking and supporting materials for the Board's consideration.

26-03-C-15 – Division Report

Division Director Lewis Polishook updated the Board on recruitment within the Division. We currently have an auditor and one investigator position that we are canvassing for and another auditor and investigator that await a canvass.

Director Polishook highlighted community outreach programs. We are holding Cemetery 101 courses across the State. There are many scheduled dates and locations across the next several months; the next one is March 18, 2026, at Mount Pleasant Cemetery in Eastern Long Island. We are distributing materials for and organizing this year's Caring for Your Cemetery Day, which will be on Saturday, April 25, and Sunday, April 26.

Assistant Director Alicia Young reported on annual report statistics. We have received 433 annual reports for the current fiscal year and received 415 annual reports since January 1 (not all of which are for the most recent fiscal year). 61% of reports for the current reporting year were received online.

26-03-D-16 – Vandalism, Abandonment and Monument Repair or Removal Fund Report

Assistant Director Young reviewed the circulated Vandalism Report. We anticipate spending our entire \$2 million appropriation for the fiscal year ending March 31.

There are five applications for funds from the vandalism fund to be reviewed at this meeting.

Breesport Hilltop Cemetery, No. 08-003 (Chemung), \$94,233.58

This cemetery seeks funds to repair 89 dangerous monuments. After discussion, a motion was made, seconded, and unanimously adopted approving the application by this cemetery for funds to repair these dangerous monuments for a total cost of \$94,233.58, subject to availability of funds.

Forest Lawn (Forest Lawn) Cemetery Group, No. 15-027 (Erie), \$91,720.74

This cemetery seeks funds to repair 79 dangerous monuments. After discussion, a motion was made, seconded, and unanimously adopted approving the application by this cemetery for funds to repair this dangerous monument for a total cost of \$91,720.74, subject to availability of funds.

Forest Lawn (Lakeside) Cemetery Group, No. 15-027 (Erie), \$41,770.30

This cemetery seeks funds to repair 40 dangerous monuments. After discussion, a motion was made,

seconded, and unanimously adopted approving the application by this cemetery for funds to repair this dangerous monument for a total cost of \$41,770.30, subject to availability of funds.

Exeter Cemetery, No. 39-010 (Otsego), \$28,579.34

This cemetery seeks funds to repair 26 dangerous monuments. After discussion, a motion was made, seconded, and unanimously adopted approving the application by this cemetery for funds to repair these dangerous monuments for a total cost of \$28,579.34, subject to availability of funds.

Pleasant Valley Cemetery, No. 45-053 (St. Lawrence), \$65,610.46

This cemetery seeks funds to repair 59 dangerous monuments. After discussion, a motion was made, seconded, and unanimously adopted approving the application by this cemetery for funds to repair this dangerous monument for a total cost of \$65,610.46, subject to availability of funds.

26-03-E-19 – Cedar Hill Cemetery, No. 36-005: Columbarium

The cemetery seeks to construct a columbarium area with associated paths.

After discussion, a motion was made, seconded, and unanimously adopted approving construction of this columbarium at a cost not to exceed \$686,399.00, subject to receipt of all other required local approvals.
